

Smallmouth Flounder

Etropus microstomus



Description:

- left eye flounder
- ♦ body unspotted
- olive brownish, usually with large blotches of darker color
- ♦ 2 or 3 dark pigmented blotches along portions of the anal and dorsal fins
- white blind side
- ovate body
- ♦ blunt snout
- small mouth (does not extend much below the lower eye)
- rounded caudal fin
- narrow ventral fin
- nearly straight lateral line
- pectoral fin on the eye side is much larger than the fin on the blind side (ocular side pectoral fin has 9-12 fin rays, blind side has 8 or 9 fin rays)

Size:

♦ up to 5 in

Range:

 Massachusetts to North Carolina, sometimes found in South Carolina and Florida

Facts:

- very similar to the Gulf Stream Flounder (the Smallmouth lacks a bony projection on its snout)
- eaten by other fish like spiny dogfish and winter flounder
- spawn near the shore
- sometimes like channels and mud bottoms
- found in water temperatures of 50-75° F
