


Spanish Mackerel

Scomberomorus maculatus



Description:

- greenish, blue back
- silvery white sides and belly
- large, oval, yellow brassy spots evenly traverse the body
- lateral line slopes evenly downward below 2nd dorsal fin
- long slender body

Size:

• up to 37 inches

Range:

- Cape Cod (rare north of Chesapeake Bay) to southern Florida and entire Gulf of Mexico
- absent from Bahamas and Antilles, but not Cuba and Haiti


Facts:

- prefers temperatures over 68 degrees
- live mostly in open water but can be found over deep grass beds, reefs, and occasionally in shallow estuaries
- feed mostly on bait fish
- major predators include dolphins and sharks
- mature at 2 years
- spawn April to May
- batch spawners (females shed their eggs more than once in a season)
- release 500,000 to 1.5 million eggs
- 2 subpopulations: one in South Atlantic and one in Gulf of Mexico (they don't travel around southern tip of Florida or Keys)
- most commonly caught from bridges
