

Striped Cusk-eel

Ophidion marginatum



Description:

- grayish green on top
- ♦ golden sides
- ♦ belly is snow white
- ♦ 2-3 dark stripes along sides
- ♦ (faint in young fish)
- ♦ dark edges on dorsal and anal fins
- males have crest at nape
- ♦ elongate body
- all unpaired fins are merged into a continuous fin
- well-developed ventral fins form long forked barbel-like structures on the throat
- scales alternating and form basket weave pattern

Size:

• up to 10 inches, typically 5-9 inches

Range:

♦ lower Hudson River, New York to northeastern Florida

Facts:

- found in shallow coastal waters, like bays and estuaries
- will back tail first into sand when frightened
- eats small crustaceans and small fish
- preyed on by larger fish, like spiny dogfish, skates and summer flounder
- spawn June through November
- active at night
- sexual dimorphism in sound producing mechanism
