

Tiger Muskie

Esox Masquinongy x Esox lucius



Description:

- light colored, branching bars on a dark blue-green background
- coloration varies
- partly scaled gill covers and fully scaled cheek like the Northern Pike
- larger than Northern Pike, smaller than Muskellunge
- deeper bodied than the Muskellunge or the Northern Pike
- tail fin more rounded than that of the Muskellunge
- ♦ 5-6 chin pores on each side

Size:

average 24-38 inches

Range:

 Canada, the Great Lakes, the upper Mississippi River Valley and both the St. Lawrence and Ohio Rivers


Facts:

- hybrid cross between Northern Pike and Muskellunge
- ♦ sterile hybrids, do not reproduce
- extremely rapid growers
- stocked as a game fish because will not reproduce and endanger native species
- like lakes and quite rivers
- opportunistic ambush predators
- spawning takes place near aquatic vegetation, debris, and leaf litter over a period of a few days
