What is R3?

- Recruitment
- Retention
- Reactivation

The R3 Program is synonymous with the New Jersey Outdoor Heritage Program where its main objective is to **recruit, retain, and reactivate** sportsmen and women conservationists into hunting and shooting sport participants.

From 2011 to 2016, the number of licensed hunters declined by 2 million people nationally. During that time, New Jersey saw a decline nearly double the national average. This poses a pitfall for state agencies and their ability to facilitate wildlife management, which is largely supported by funding from sportsmen and women. Excise taxes on hunting and shooting equipment, as well as license fees are significant funding sources for state fish and wildlife agencies, much like our agency here in New Jersey. Here in NJ, the development of an R3 program began 2018 to develop new, innovative programs, and enhance existing recruitment, retention, and reactivation programs to increase hunting and recreational shooting participation in New Jersey.

May & June Events:

- Women's Mentored Turkey Hunt: Was offered to first time/beginner female turkey hunters on May 2-4. Participants learned how to call, pattern, scout, and hunt turkeys with the help from mentors and division staff in the Southern Region.
- <u>Locavore to the Core GoToWebinar:</u> Virtual event offered to all! Learn how to be a New Jersey Locavore on May 13, 2021 at 7:00 p.m.
- <u>Family Fun Shoot:</u> Offered to families to enjoy a free night trap shooting. No experience is necessary! June 3, 2021 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. offered

April Events:

• Intro to Turkey Calling Presented by NWTF President Lou Gamble. Lou discussed turkey calling tactics and techniques to 161 attendants.

March Events:

- Shed Hunting Webinar: Ben Westfall from the National Deer Association discussed the antler shedding process, and New Jersey Conservation Police Officer Andrew Riviello, discussed the legality of shed hunting. 108 hunters and nonhunters alike were attendance.
- Couples Night Fun Shoot: 25 couples in attendance enjoyed a free night on the range. Participants were taught firearm safety and basic shotgun shooting techniques with instructors from the Pine Valley Trap Club in Berlin, NJ.

R3 Recipes to Share!

Wild Turkey Crunch Wrap Supreme for Two!

Ingredients:

- Two turkey tenderloins
- Choice of cooking oil
- 1 egg (whisked)
- ¼ cup flour
- ¼ cup panko breadcrumbs & 1
 TBSP Lemon Pepper
 Seasoning mixture
- 4 oz Pepper jack Cheese

- 12" Flour Tortilla (2)
- 8" Flour Tortilla (2)
- Tostada Shell (2)
- 1 Avocado (sliced)
- Shredded Lettuce
- 1 Large. Tomato (Diced)
- ¼ red/green bell pepper (diced)
- Sour Cream (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Heat oil in skillet on medium to high heat. Pat tenderloins dry with paper towel, coat in flour, and dip into egg.
- 2. Coat Tenderloins in breading/seasoning mixture and place in skillet. Cook 3-5 minutes on both sides, until golden brown.
- 3. Remove from skillet and slice into ½" strips (against the grain). Set aside.
- 4. On large tortilla, layer: cheese, avocado, turkey, tostada, & remainder vegetables. (Do not over fill)
- Place smaller tortilla on top to encase ingredients.
 Fold the edges of the larger tortilla tightly over smaller tortilla.
- 6. In a heated and lightly oiled skillet, place folded crunch wrap supreme seam side down first, to seal your supreme.
- 7. Carefully flip after 1-2 minutes and cook for another 1-2 minutes or until both sides are golden brown.
- 8. Remove from skillet and serve hot with sour cream.
- *This recipe makes two crunch wraps supreme. ENJOY!
