DESCRIPTION:

Lauren Frazee, New Jersey AmeriCorps Watershed Ambassador for the Crosswicks, Doctors, and Assiscunk Creek Watersheds, hosted a Community Tree Planting to celebrate Earth and Arbor Day. By partnering with the Bordentown Township Environmental Commission and Public Works Department, she organized 23 volunteers in planting, mulching, caging, tagging and watering 75 native tree saplings along Thorton Creek in Bossert Park. The event took place on April 20, 2013.

IMPACT:

The project aims to improve water quality in the Lower Crosswicks Creek by re-foresting the stream banks with trees that will reduce soil erosion, shade the stream, filter pollutants, and provide habitat for wildlife. In addition, every volunteer learned how to properly plant a bare-root tree sapling.
