

 13 of N.J.S.A. 736-2628 et seq, the Morris
 14 County Park Commission notified the public
 15 in legal notice to the public in the Daily
 16 Record and the Star Ledger on March 25th
 17 and 26th, 2010 that public spoken hearing
 18 on the proposed major diversion of park
 19 land at Mahlon Dickerson Reservation in
 20 Jefferson Township, County of Morris, New
 21 Jersey is being convened at 7:30 p.m.
 22 prevailing time on Monday, April 26, 2010
 23 in the clubhouse at Berkshire Valley Golf
 24 Course, 28 Cozy Lake Road in the Township
 25 of Jefferson, County of Morris, New

1 MS. SCHLEICHER: This meeting
 2 will come to order. This is the 741st
 3 meeting of the Morris County Park
 4 Commission. Can we have a reading of the
 5 notice.
 6 MR. HELMER: Pursuant to
 7 N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et seq adequate notice of
 8 the meeting being held at 7:30 p.m. on
 9 Monday, April 26, 2010 has been provided
 10 by and notified in the Daily Record and
 11 the Star Ledger by posting said notice in
 12 the administration building of the Morris
 13 County Park Commission at the County
 14 Courthouse.
 15 MS. SCHLEICHER: We'll have a
 16 roll call.
 17 MR. HELMER: Commissioner Baron?
 18 MS. BARON: Aye.

 2 Notice of the public scoping
 3 hearing was also provided by posting
 4 public hearing signs at Mahlon Dickerson
 5 Reservation as pursuant to N.J.A.C. 736-25
 6 and 26 reviewed at the Park Commission's
 7 Public Workshop Meeting on Tuesday, April
 8 13, 2010 and written notifications of the
 9 New Jersey Green Acres Program, Jefferson
 10 Township Governing Body, Jefferson
 11 Township Planning Board, Jefferson
 12 Township Environmental Committee,
 13 Jefferson Township Open Space Advisory
 14 Committee, Morris County Board of Chosen
 15 Freeholders, Morris County Planning Board,
 16 the Morris County Open Space Committee and
 17 the New Jersey Highlands Council.
 18 I'll review the purpose of
 19 tonight's meeting and some historical
 20 background. The purpose of the scoping
 21 hearing is for the public to provide
 22 and/or submit comments in the proposed
 23 major diversions of parklands as required
 24 by the New Jersey Department of
 25 Environmental Protection Green Acres

1 Program rules N.J.A.C. 736. The Park
2 Commission is accepting comments on
3 alternative sites suggested by the public
4 and on alternative methods of achieving
5 the project's objectives without the
6 diversion of parkland.

7 It should also be known that if
8 anybody provided previous testimony before
9 the Park Commission last July, both your
10 taped testimony as well as any hard
11 documents you've sent are actually with us
12 and part of the final minutes of the
13 meeting, also.

14 Anyone wishing to speak must
15 sign in on the hearing citizen sheet which
16 will become part of the hearing minutes.
17 That's the yellow sheet on the clipboard
18 in the doorway. We have it here. Before
19 speaking, please state your name and
20 address clearly. All comments relevant to
21 oppose major diversion, each speaker has
22 five minutes to present their comments and
23 please try and refrain from repetitive
24 from previous speakers. If you're part of
25 a group or organization, it's appreciated

1 if a single representative presents
2 comments on behalf of the organization.
3 If you're going to submit an exhibit,
4 please make sure the document has a name,
5 name of the person or entity that created
6 the document and date submitted. Exhibits
7 and documents will become part of the
8 record.

9 Written comments can be mailed
10 to my attention at the Morris County Park
11 Commission, P.O. Box 1295, Morristown, New
12 Jersey or by fax at (973)644-2726 or by
13 e-mail to info@morrissparks.net by Monday,
14 May 10, 2010. Submitted written comments
15 will also become part of the record.

16 The Park Commission will not be
17 responding to comments until after the
18 public comment period ends on Monday, May
19 10, 2010. Responses and comments will be
20 made available and will become part of the
21 record at the Park Commission's Monday,
22 June 28, 2010 Park Commission's Meeting.

23 As part of the Green Acres
24 Program rules for scoping hearings, a few
25 areas will be reviewed prior to opening to

1 the public. The description of the
2 proposed diversion: No structures will be
3 placed on the parkland. Both lots to be
4 affected are to be affected by aerial
5 diversions with the proposed new
6 transmission lines that will be in
7 airspace above the property within the
8 existing right-of-way.

9 Even though the power lines are
10 in the existing right-of-way, the original
11 landowner's crafted language in the
12 right-of-way documents to the town for any
13 future changes to the power lines
14 themselves. The lots and blocks affected
15 are Block 320 Lot 9 in Jefferson Township.
16 Lot size is 5.53 acres on the southwest
17 boundary of Mahlon Dickerson Reservation
18 located between Weldon Road and State
19 Highway 15 closer to Weldon Road formerly
20 the Ogden Mine Ranch of the Central
21 Railroad Company. Public Service Electric
22 & Gas Company has had right-of-way since
23 July 26, 1929.

24 The other lot and block to be
25 affected is Block 335 Lot 4 in Jefferson

1 Township. The lot size is 11 acres in the
2 southeast boundary of Mahlon Dickerson
3 Reservation in the area of the former
4 Weldon and Lower Weldon Mines. Consumers
5 call it Ice Company and Public Service
6 Electric & Gas has had the right-of-way
7 there since April 1, 1930.

8 Both lots are part of land
9 originally bequeathed by the estate of
10 Richard Bey Saffin and to the Morris
11 County Park Commission May 12, 1983. A
12 total of 673 acres was donated to expand
13 the Mahlon Dickerson Reservation, whose
14 total park acreage is now 3,337 acres.

15 The total acreage affected by
16 the diversion will be determined by the
17 number of additional lines, height, length
18 and diameter of the wires. The major
19 diversion application is for a portion of
20 an overhead electric transmission line as
21 part of the Roseland-Susquehanna
22 Transmission overhead electric
23 transmission project. PSE&G to comply
24 with prior directive from PJM in order to
25 supply the regional electric transmission

1 reliability.
 2 PSE&G general regulatory
 3 counsel, David Richter will be reviewing
 4 the following areas of the proposed
 5 diversion, its compelling public need and
 6 the need that the project will fulfill,
 7 public benefits the project would yield
 8 and review past and ongoing efforts to
 9 identify alternatives to propose
 10 diversion, why the alternatives were
 11 rejected and process to identify
 12 compensation for the diversion.
 13 MS. SCHLEICHER: I would like
 14 someone to move that we open the public
 15 hearing.
 16 MS. BARON: So moved.
 17 MS. SCHLEICHER: Ms. Baron. Can
 18 we have a second?
 19 MR. CAMERON: Second.
 20 MS. SCHLEICHER: Nick. Can we
 21 have a roll call?
 22 MR. HELMER: Commissioner Baron?
 23 MS. BARON: Yes.
 24 MR. HELMER: Commissioner Kelly?
 25 MR. KELLY: Yes.

1 MR. HELMER: Commissioner
 2 Cass-Schmidt?
 3 MS. CASS-SCHMIDT: Yes.
 4 MR. HELMER: Commissioner
 5 Seabury?
 6 MR. SEABURY: Aye.
 7 MR. HELMER: Commissioner
 8 Cameron?
 9 MR. CAMERON: Yes.
 10 MR. HELMER: Commissioner
 11 Schleicher?
 12 MS. SCHLEICHER: Yes. We can
 13 accept comments now. Mr. Richter?
 14 MR. RICHTER: Good evening. My
 15 name is David Richter. I'm assistant
 16 general regulatory counsel with Public
 17 Service Electric & Gas Company. I'm going
 18 to quickly review the project, the
 19 benefits and the alternatives that PSE&G
 20 looked at.
 21 The project is an upgrade to an
 22 existing 230 KV transmission line running
 23 from Susquehanna, Pennsylvania to
 24 Roseland, New Jersey, approximately, 144
 25 miles. The project is an upgrade to the

1 230 KV line adding an additional 500 KV
 2 transmission line to the right-of-way. It
 3 will be on the existing right-of-way that
 4 was purchased by PSE&G as an easement in
 5 between 1927 and 1930.
 6 The project was mandated by an
 7 entity called PJM Interconnections, LLC.
 8 PJM is a Federally mandated regional
 9 transmission organization under the
 10 auspices of the Federal Energy Regulatory
 11 Commission and this agency, PJM, controls
 12 and operates the transmission systems in
 13 13 states, one of them including New
 14 Jersey. PJM reviews the transmission
 15 system in determining what upgrades are
 16 needed on the system and then orders the
 17 specific utility in that area to build the
 18 transmission upgrade.
 19 This project was extensively
 20 reviewed by the Board of Public Utilities
 21 of New Jersey during a long hearing
 22 process at the Board. After that process
 23 the Board had determined that this project
 24 was reasonably necessary for the service,
 25 convenience or welfare of the public.

1 This line will provide a
 2 compelling public benefit by continuing to
 3 provide safe, adequate and reliable
 4 electric service to the region, including
 5 the North Jersey region. It will also
 6 ensure compliance with Federal regional
 7 transmission reliability criteria which
 8 will allow a strengthening of the power
 9 supply system in this area.
 10 Again, looking at the compelling
 11 public benefit, the Board of Public
 12 Utilities, again, extensively reviewed
 13 this project and again, determined this
 14 was reasonably necessary for the service,
 15 convenience or welfare of the public. As
 16 I mentioned, the new line will be located
 17 within an existing right-of-way, so no new
 18 additional land will be acquired for the
 19 project on Green Acres property.
 20 PSE&G did look at alternatives
 21 which were reviewed during the BPU process
 22 and I'll go over them today. Alternative
 23 one was to not build the project.
 24 Obviously, was since this project is
 25 mandated by the Energy Regulatory

1 Commission as part of a reliability
2 project, PSE&G did not believe that this
3 was a proper alternative to pursue because
4 it would be putting the electric system
5 and in the reliability of the electric
6 system at risk. Therefore, PSE&G rejected
7 this alternative.

8 Alternative two was to place the
9 facilities underground. First, I'm not
10 sure that would reduce the diversion here
11 since we'll still be adding a line. In
12 the United States of America, there are no
13 500 KV lines underground currently. There
14 is a small installation in Japan, but the
15 liability records for the installation
16 have not been able to be reviewed by other
17 utilities. So for a reliability project
18 such as this, which the reliability of the
19 electric system relies on it, it would be
20 imprudent to install technology that has
21 not been proven to be reliable in the
22 United States. Therefore, the underground
23 alternative was rejected.

24 Alternative three was to create
25 a brand new right-of-way for the 500 KV

1 line. Keep the existing 230 KV line in
2 its current right-of-way and build a new
3 right-of-way for the 500 KV line. This
4 alternative would increase the amount of
5 impact to the environment, the clearing of
6 right-of-way for this and acquisition of
7 private-owned public property for that
8 right-of-way. Therefore, PSE&G rejected
9 this alternative and determined it was
10 better to install within the existing
11 right-of-way to minimize those
12 environmental impacts.

13 Alternative four was to place
14 the line outside of the Morris County
15 Parks Green Acres property. Although the
16 impact to the specific location that we
17 are talking about today, many of the
18 surrounding properties are also Green Acre
19 encumbered properties preserved for open
20 space and recreation. Therefore, by
21 installing the facilities outside of the
22 Morris County Parks, we would be
23 increasing impact to other Green Acres
24 areas as well as increasing the
25 environmental impact associated with a new

1 area outside of the current right-of-way.
2 So, therefore, PSE&G rejected alternative
3 four.

4 Finally, alternative five was to
5 develop other technologies, such as wind
6 or solar or other resolutions to the
7 reliability issues that PJM has raised in
8 this particular issue. Certainly as a
9 company, PSE&G is currently investing in
10 solar and wind. However, as determined by
11 PJM and reviewed and agreed upon by the
12 Board of Public Utilities, the best
13 alternative the reliability issues in this
14 case is an additional 500 KV line.
15 Therefore, PSE&G rejected this final
16 alternative five.

17 Again, the compelling public
18 interest here is the reliability of the
19 electric system and PSE&G, therefore,
20 requests the diversion on those Green
21 Acres properties.

22 One other thing with the
23 compensation. The compensation is a
24 monetary compensation. It was determined
25 under the Green Acres regulations

1 currently the Green Acres regulations
2 required a ten to one ratio of
3 compensation. Therefore, for every acre
4 we disturb, we have to provide
5 compensation for ten acres. That's it.
6 Thank you very much.

7 MS. SCHLEICHER: Thank you. I'd
8 like to now take those wishing to speak.
9 Paul Boudreau?

10 MR. BOUDREAU: Thank you very
11 much. My name is Paul Boudreau. I'm with
12 the Morris County Chamber of Commerce at
13 25 Lindsley Drive in Morristown. We've
14 been very involved in this project now for
15 over a year. I testified at the BPU
16 hearings and at the Highlands Council last
17 year and our biggest concern is
18 reliability. If you think about the
19 difficult times we've been having in the
20 last 18 months, one of the jobs that we
21 are trying to perform in Morris County, of
22 course, is to keep the companies we have
23 here and bring in new companies and all of
24 us read everyday about the challenges that
25 the state has and the challenges we have

1 in convincing businesses that they ought
2 to be in Morris County and ought to be in
3 New Jersey. The last thing we want to add
4 to their list of concerns is, gee, we may
5 not have reliable power for you in the
6 future. So we are very concerned about
7 this issue of possible brownouts and
8 blackouts by 2012, 2013. PJM has
9 identified that as a major issue going
10 forward and obviously, the basis for the
11 need for the project.

12 One of the things I did about 18
13 months ago is went back into congressional
14 record and read all of the testimony that
15 PJM gave to the United States Congress on
16 the need for this upgrade and I was
17 convinced after reading that, in fact, we
18 had a significant potential problem coming
19 down the road, something that was going to
20 affect not only businesses in Morris
21 County, but businesses across New Jersey.

22 So reliability is a key issue
23 for us as we move forward and it's so
24 interesting to see the debate around the
25 country about nuclear power, wind, clean

1 who are concerned about the environment
2 and if you would have sat through those
3 discussions at the Highland Council, you
4 would have heard and seen all of the
5 arguments around the environment and what
6 PSE&G is doing and I happen to think they
7 have done a fantastic job in trying to
8 step up to environmental issues that
9 people have raised around the project and
10 try to reduce the footprint of the project
11 in a variety of ways.

12 The work they are going to do
13 obviously in the Highlands area is going
14 to be very important in terms of
15 purchasing critical lands in that area and
16 ensuring water quality and I think if you
17 look at the company's track record and the
18 leadership of the organization you can
19 feel comfortable that, in fact, they are
20 going to do what they say they are going
21 to do.

22 So the Morris County Chamber of
23 Commerce is very comfortable in supporting
24 the project and hoping that you will do
25 what you can to move it forward. We are

1 coal, all of these things. The bottom
2 line, regardless of what you support is,
3 we have to wheel this power. We have to
4 have a robust transmission system to get
5 it from point A to point B. So it
6 shouldn't be a debate necessarily about
7 where we're going to get the power because
8 at the end of the day we are going to have
9 to wheel it and we are going to have to
10 have the transmission in place to make
11 that happen.

12 Did You know that the current
13 line was built in 1931? The needs of our
14 modern world are creating a dangerous
15 strain on the system with overloaded
16 circuits potential problems for our
17 communities and inefficiencies for
18 consumers when quality of service
19 deteriorates if we don't do something
20 about it.

21 On the environmental front, I
22 have watched PSE&G, you know, go out of
23 their way at every corner to try to meet
24 with, discuss, be open and transparent
25 with people concerned across Morris County

1 convinced that if we want to continue to
2 have the business environment that we want
3 in the future where we are creating jobs
4 and our ability to keep companies that are
5 here and to attract new companies in the
6 future, this is an important project to
7 get underway as soon as possible and I
8 will hope that you will support it. Thank
9 you.

10 MS. SCHLEICHER: Tom Hill.
11 MR. HILL: Tom Hill. I'm here
12 representing Stop The Lines, a grassroots
13 organization that coalesce to question
14 whether this project should be allowed.
15 You heard from the distinguished gentleman
16 from the Morris County Chamber of Commerce
17 about need and how good the PSE&G treats
18 the environment. What you didn't hear or
19 see is how PSE&G's contractors treat the
20 environment when they have a big project.
21 They tore up land directly across the
22 street from me in regards to vegetation
23 management, tilling the soil down three or
24 four inches, driving track vehicles
25 through a class one protected stream.

1 They are not good stewards of the
 2 environment. Their contractors are not
 3 good stewards of the environment.
 4 You guys really can't decide
 5 anything on that. What you are here to
 6 decide is to allow a change in use of land
 7 for a project for profit can be done and
 8 the gentleman who donated the land asked
 9 specifically that that land not be used
 10 for this purpose and that's what I'm
 11 asking you to do, treat the person who
 12 started your Park Commission properly
 13 because his gift to the Morris County
 14 Parks Commission was not for this use. It
 15 was for the public's use. Not for a
 16 public company. Thank you.

17 MS. SCHLEICHER: Thank you,
 18 Mr. Hill. Ann Augustin.

19 MS. AUGUSTIN: I'm a resident of
 20 Jefferson. I think I've attended all of
 21 the meetings that you've had in the
 22 Department of the Interior and the rest
 23 and I think the health and aesthetic and
 24 environmental and public benefit issues
 25 have pretty much been covered. I've heard

1 some testimony that was very impressive on
 2 that in terms of trying to preserve
 3 somewhat rural quality that we have here
 4 and the aesthetics which would be markedly
 5 changed if this were to go through.

6 But I think as a concerned
 7 citizen, I just don't understand at this
 8 point what these meetings are
 9 accomplishing because when I looked at
 10 Friday's Daily Record, it says, PSE&G to
 11 start new power line. BPU clears the plan
 12 and they are going to break dirt. It just
 13 seems to me that this is just listening to
 14 people talk, but everything is in the
 15 works already. So I'm a little
 16 disconcerted about that. I know this is
 17 not question and answer, but I don't know
 18 how to reconcile the plan going on with
 19 people still giving testimony. Thanks.

20 MS. SCHLEICHER: Just to answer
 21 the question, from our perspective the
 22 first scoping hearing that I believe you
 23 were at there was an improper notice by
 24 one day and that's why we are redoing the
 25 scoping here. It's a procedural thing.

1 MS. AUGUSTIN: No, I understand
 2 that, but the fact that project is
 3 underway --

4 MS. SCHLEICHER: I understand
 5 that, too.

6 MS. AUGUSTIN: What are we
 7 talking about then? That's running behind
 8 the cart that's already taken off.

9 MS. SCHLEICHER: Elliot Ruga.

10 MR. RUGA: Good evening. My
 11 name is Elliot Ruga from the New Jersey
 12 Highlands Commission. Since 1988 we've
 13 been active in preserving the water and
 14 other natural and cultural resources of
 15 the New Jersey Highlands Region. I'd like
 16 to mention that the New Jersey Energy
 17 Master Plan finds that this project
 18 proposed by PSE&G is intrinsically
 19 unreliable.

20 Long runs of transmission lines
 21 importing dirty coal from unregulated,
 22 coal-fired plant in the south and the west
 23 and those prevailing winds carry those
 24 emissions and pollute the water and the
 25 air quality in New Jersey. The New Jersey

1 Energy Master Plan mandates local
 2 generation of clean alternative power
 3 sources on shorter transmission runs.

4 I'd like you to consider the
 5 height of these towers, a maximum of 195
 6 feet. The existing towers at,
 7 approximately, 85 feet are just below the
 8 treeline. So they are barely noticeable.
 9 I'm a afraid of people waking up one day
 10 and seeing these poles at 1,000 foot apart
 11 extending 115 feet above the treeline
 12 saying, what the heck happened? How did
 13 we allow that to happen? How did we allow
 14 this to ruin our view scapes, our view
 15 sheds that we cherish, our parks and our
 16 natural places?

17 Aside from that, the access
 18 roads that are required for construction
 19 of these towers are in many cases logging
 20 roads, single-track trails. They are not
 21 roads. They are trails that will have to
 22 be widened and graded. A lot of them in
 23 our parklands. Some of them in Mahlon
 24 Dickerson and that will have long-term,
 25 perhaps, permanent consequences to our

1 environment, our water quality and water
 2 quantity due to storm water runoff and the
 3 destruction of critical habitat.
 4 So let me just leave you with
 5 this, I always wondered why, what is so
 6 sexy about electricity that is not --that
 7 water doesn't seem to generate. We can't
 8 live without water and indeed, we cannot
 9 live without electricity. But how has
 10 PSE&G and PJM succeeded into creating this
 11 atmosphere of fear that if we don't do
 12 this project and we don't do it soon, we
 13 are going to perhaps have a couple hours
 14 each year of brownouts and blackouts which
 15 has been and the basis -- their
 16 projections are from 2006, that's outdated
 17 projections, that newer information
 18 suggests that energy demand has
 19 significantly declined since then.
 20 So we put at risk our water
 21 supply and the fragile ecosystems of the
 22 Highlands which we are in right now which
 23 Mahlon Dickerson is part of, which if we
 24 degrade to the point that water becomes
 25 that much more expensive, that much more

1 of a rare resource, we will suffer, but
 2 somehow PSE&G has managed to convince
 3 everyone that we are going to run out of
 4 electricity unless we do this project.
 5 Thank you.
 6 MS. SCHLEICHER: Thank you.
 7 Paul French?
 8 MR. FRENCH: Thank you. How are
 9 you doing? I'm a member of Longwood Lake
 10 Cabin Owners Association and very
 11 concerned about this project because I
 12 grew up three miles down the road. PS is
 13 this wonderful company that's bringing all
 14 this great power that is unneeded and coal
 15 fired with dirty coal and they are going
 16 to protect the parks.
 17 Anyone, anyone involved anywhere
 18 in this project would like to go see how
 19 PS blatantly disregards and maintains
 20 their right-of-ways on private property,
 21 please feel free to give them my
 22 information and I will meet with anyone,
 23 anytime and any group size to show them
 24 how PS does not care. They are doing this
 25 for profit and no other reason. There are

1 much better, more efficient resources and
 2 easier ways to get it there than
 3 destroying our state land, private land or
 4 anything in the paths of it.
 5 If you read your newspapers,
 6 follow this project from start to finish,
 7 there is a lot of endorsement to what I
 8 just said. Thanks for hearing me.
 9 MS. SCHLEICHER: Thank you very

 22 received by Monday, May 10, 2010. I'll be
 23 providing a summary of the public comments
 24 made at the scoping hearing and answer any
 25 specific questions related to the

1 diversion in writing that will become part
2 of the minutes and also sent down to the
3 New Jersey Green Acres Program and Bureau
4 of Legal Services and Stewardship.

5 At the Park Commission's Monday,
6 June 28, 2010 public meeting, the
7 resolution whether or not to support the
8 submission of the Statehouse Commission
9 application to NJDEP to create a program
10 for a major diversion will be voted on and
11 sent to the New Jersey Green Acres Program
12 along with the pre-application for the
13 major diversion. Our intent is to have
14 the meeting at this location, but if due
15 to play on the golf course, we might be
16 going to Camp Jefferson again, but that
17 will also be publicly noticed.

18 New Jersey Green Acres Program
19 reviews pre-application 15 days as long as
20 it's by the second Thursday of the month.
21 If the application is deemed sufficient
22 and the New Jersey Green Acres will
23 authorize the Park Commission to submit
24 final application within 180 days of
25 authorization. A public hearing on final

1 application will be scheduled in Jefferson
2 Township to receive oral and written
3 comments on the application. The NJDEP
4 Commissioner will approve or disprove the
5 final application and the Statehouse
6 Commission hearing will then be scheduled.

7 MS. SCHLEICHER: On behalf of
8 the Park Commission, I'd like to thank all
9 of you for coming out. Again, I
10 apologize. It wasn't our doing, but you
11 had to do this twice. There is a third
12 session as Dave mentioned on June 28th.

13 MR. HELMER: It will either be
14 at 7:30 at a regular Park Commission
15 meeting or it may be earlier depending on
16 the schedule. If it's at Camp Jefferson,
17 you can call in prior to the meeting and I
18 can let you know what we decide. It's a
19 public hearing opposed to a scoping
20 hearing.


