MASONRY REPAIRS

Where cracked and spalled or exfoliated, limestone, sandstone, marble, terra cotta, and cast stone or concrete materials should be repaired to prevent further deterioration. Replacement in-kind of individual units may be appropriate in instances of extensive or severe deterioration. Where localized damage exists, repair of existing masonry units should occur; repair material should match the original in strength, color, texture, tooling, and all dimensions, profiles, and visual quality. Otherwise sound surfaces must not be parged or coated achieve uniform appearance. a Appropriate consolidation repair techniques are described in The Maintenance and Repair of Architectural Sandstone, which may be obtained for a nominal fee from:
