

Violation and Elimination - Warren Brothers Company,
Planter Avenue, Prospect Park, N. J.
May 16-20, 1974 (T. Costello)

While inspecting the Passaic River in the Prospect Park area, Inspector T. Costello, along with Ass't Chief River Inspector Fleming, noticed oily films at the base of the 36-inch Prospect Park storm sewer at the foot of No. 6th Street. This was traced back to the Warren Brothers and Sowerbutt Quarry.

Mr. P. Schuster, President, explained that during the night some vandals had filled the fuel oil tank on a paving machine with stones. That morning personnel emptied the tank (about 30 gallons of diesel oil) into a sand pile (thinking the sand would absorb the oil). Subsequently, the water tank truck, which is used to spray the yard for dust control, came too close to the oil saturated sand and washed the oil out to the storm drain. It was not until May 20th that the drain was clear of any signs of oil.

Violation and Elimination - Wiggins Plastic Molding Co.

March 26, 1974 (A. Dondero)

On March 26, 1974 at 9:30 A.M., Inspector Dondero noticed an oil slick traveling downstream in Third River.

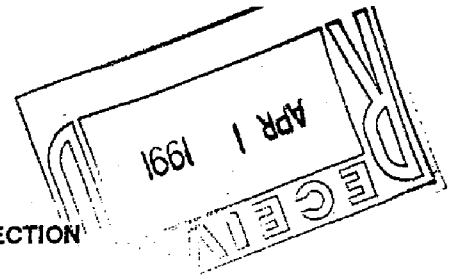
He traced it back to a 3" metal outlet from the Wiggins Co. to Third River. Mr. Dondero contacted Mr. W. Kroeschel, Plant Manager, and was told the outlet was a discharge of cooling water from two New Britain Molding Machines. Mr. Dondero pointed out the oil and directed him to shut off the machines until the source of pollution could be found and halted.

Mr. Dondero returned at 2:45 P.M. and could find no trace of oil in Third River. He contacted Mr. Kroeschel, who told him that the after-cooler above one of the machines had been leaking oil and the machine would be kept out of operation until the necessary parts on order were received and the after-cooler repaired.



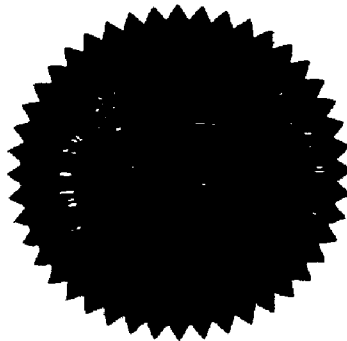

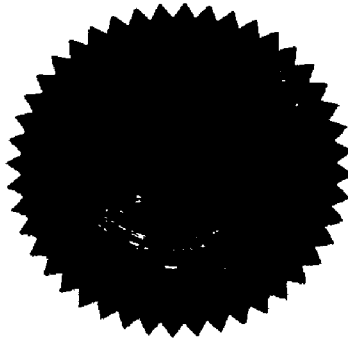

NAMES OF MERGING CORPORATIONS

1.1 The names of the corporations proposing to merge are Wiggins Plastics, Inc., a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New Jersey (hereinafter called "Wiggins") and Wiggins Plastics Holdings, Inc., a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New Jersey (hereinafter called "Holdings").

1.2 The name of the surviving corporation into which Holdings will merge is Wiggins Plastics, Inc.

ARTICLE II

SHARES OF CONSTITUENT CORPORATIONS

2.1 As to each Constituent Corporation, the designation and number of outstanding shares of each class in series and the voting rights are:

(a) Wiggins has outstanding 61,881 shares of voting common stock ("Wiggins Common Stock")

(b) Holdings has outstanding 10 shares of Class A Voting Common Stock and 90 shares of Class B Non-Voting Common Stock (collectively, "Holdings Common Stock").

(c) The number of shares mentioned above is not subject to change prior to the effective date of this Merger.

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ARTICLE III

EFFECTS OF THE MERGER; AMENDMENT OF CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

3.1 The Merger. Holdings shall be merged with and into Wiggins at the Effective Time (as hereinafter defined). At the Effective Time, the separate existence of Holdings shall cease, and Wiggins shall continue as the surviving corporation (the "Surviving Corporation").

3.2 Effective Time. The Merger shall become effective upon the filing of the Certificate of Merger with the New Jersey Secretary of State (the "Effective Time").

3.3 Effects of the Merger. The Merger shall have the effects set forth in Section 14A:10-6 of the NJBCA. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, and subject thereto, at the Effective Time, all the properties, rights, privileges, powers and franchises of Wiggins and Holdings shall vest in the Surviving Corporation, and all debts, liabilities and duties of Wiggins and Holdings shall be and become the debts, liabilities and duties of the Surviving Corporation.

3.4 Certificate of Incorporation; By-laws.

(a) At the Effective Time, Holdings's certificate of incorporation shall be the certificate of incorporation of the Surviving Corporation until thereafter changed or amended as provided therein or by applicable law provided, however, that from and after the Effective Time, Article I thereof shall be amended so as to read in its entirety as follows: "The name of the Corporation is Wiggins Plastics, Inc."

(b) The by-laws of Holdings as in effect at the Effective Time shall, from and after the Effective Time, be the by-laws of the Surviving Corporation until thereafter changed or amended as provided therein or by applicable law.

3.5 Directors. The directors of Holdings at the Effective Time shall, from and after the Effective Time, become the directors of the Surviving Corporation, until the earlier of their resignation or removal or until their respective successors are duly elected and qualified, as the case may be.

3.6 Officers. The officers of Wiggins at the Effective Time shall, from and after the Effective Time, become the officers of the Surviving Corporation until the earlier of their resignation or removal or until their respective successors are duly elected and qualified, as the case may be provided, however, that from and after the Effective Time, Isaac Weinberger shall be the President and Chief Executive Officer of the Surviving Corporation.

ARTICLE IV

CONVERSION OF SHARES

4.1 Effect on Capital Stock. As of the Effective Time, by virtue of the Merger and without any action on the part of the holder of (i) any shares of Wiggins Common Stock or (ii) any shares of Holdings Common Stock:

(a) Conversion of Common Stock. Each share of Wiggins Common Stock issued and outstanding immediately prior to the Effective Time (other than shares to be cancelled in accordance with Section 4.1(b)) shall be converted into the right to receive the applicable portion of the Merger Consideration as determined pursuant to Section 4.2. The "Merger Consideration" shall consist of the following:

(i) \$1,500,000 in cash (the "Initial Cash Consideration"), as the same may be adjusted by the difference between the net worth of Wiggins at the Effective Time and the net worth of Wiggins at July 31, 1998, and

(ii) promissory notes of Wiggins in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,700,000 (each, a "Note" and, collectively, the "Notes").

(b) Cancellation of Treasury Stock. Each share of Wiggins Common Stock, and all other shares of capital stock of Wiggins that are owned by Wiggins as treasury stock shall automatically be cancelled and retired and shall cease to exist, and no cash or other consideration shall be delivered or deliverable in exchange therefor.

(c) Common Stock of Holdings. Each share of Class A Voting Common Stock and each share of Class B Non-Voting Common Stock of Holdings issued and outstanding immediately prior to the Effective Time shall, by virtue of the Merger and without any action on the part of the holder thereof, be converted into one share of Class A Voting Common Stock of the Surviving Corporation or one share of Class B Non-Voting Common Stock of the Surviving Corporation, respectively (collectively, "Surviving Corporation Common Stock").







The United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") is charged with responding to the release and/or threatened release of hazardous substances, pollutants, and contaminants into the environment and with enforcement responsibilities under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980, as amended ("CERCLA"), 42 U.S.C. §9601 et seq. Accordingly, EPA is seeking your cooperation in an innovative approach to environmental remediation and restoration activities for the Lower Passaic River.

EPA has documented the release or threatened release of hazardous substances, pollutants and contaminants into the six-mile stretch of the river, known as the Passaic River Study Area, which is part of the Diamond Alkali Superfund Site ("Site") located in Newark, New Jersey. Based on the results of previous CERCLA remedial investigation activities and other environmental studies, including a reconnaissance study of the Passaic River conducted by the United States Army Corps of Engineers ("USACE"), EPA has further determined that contaminated sediments and other potential sources of hazardous substances exist along the entire 17-mile tidal reach of the Lower Passaic River. Thus, EPA has decided to expand the Study to include the areal extent of contamination to which hazardous substances from the six-mile stretch were transported; and those sources from which hazardous substances outside the six-mile stretch have come to be located within the expanded Study Area.

By this letter, EPA is notifying Wiggins Plastics Inc. ("Wiggins") of its potential liability relating to the Site pursuant to Section 107(a) of CERCLA, 42 U.S.C. §9607(a). Under CERCLA, potentially responsible parties ("PRPs") include current and past owners of a facility, as well as persons who arranged for the disposal or treatment of hazardous substances at the Site, or the transport of hazardous substances to the Site.

In recognition of our complementary roles, EPA has formed a partnership with USACE and the New Jersey Department of Transportation-Office of Maritime Resources ("OMR") ["the governmental partnership"] to identify and to address water quality improvement, remediation, and restoration opportunities in the 17-mile Lower Passaic River. This governmental partnership is consistent with a national Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") executed on July 2, 2002 between EPA and USACE. This MOU calls for the two agencies to cooperate, where appropriate, on environmental remediation and restoration of degraded urban rivers and related resources. In agreeing to implement the MOU, the EPA and USACE will use their existing statutory and regulatory authorities in a coordinated manner. These authorities for EPA include CERCLA, the Clean Water Act, and the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act. The USACE's authority stems from the Water Resources Development Act ("WRDA"). WRDA allows for the use of some federal funds to pay for a portion of the USACE's approved projects related to ecosystem restoration.

For the first phase of the Lower Passaic River Project, the governmental partners are proceeding with an integrated five- to seven-year study to determine an appropriate remediation and restoration plan for the river. The study will involve investigation of environmental impacts and pollution sources, as well as evaluation of alternative actions, leading to recommendations of environmental remediation and restoration activities. This study is being conducted by EPA under the authority of CERCLA and by USACE and OMR, as local sponsor, under WRDA. EPA, USACE, and OMR are coordinating with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the Federal and State Natural Resource Trustee agencies. EPA, USACE, and OMR estimate that the study will cost approximately \$20 million, with the WRDA and CERCLA shares being about \$10 million each. EPA will be seeking its share of the costs of the study from PRPs.

Based on information that EPA evaluated during the course of its investigation of the Site, EPA believes that hazardous substances were being released from Wiggins' facility located at 180 Kingsland Road in Clifton, New Jersey, into the Lower Passaic River. Hazardous substances, pollutants and contaminants released from the facility into the river present a risk to the environment and the humans who may ingest contaminated fish and shellfish. Therefore, Wiggins may be potentially liable for response costs which the government may incur relating to the study of the Lower Passaic River. In addition, responsible parties may be required to pay damages for injury to, destruction of, or loss of natural resources, including the cost of assessing such damages.

Enclosed is a list of the other PRPs who have received Notice letters. This list represents EPA's findings on the identities of PRPs to date. We are continuing efforts to locate additional PRPs who have released hazardous substances, directly or indirectly, into the Passaic River. Inclusion on, or exclusion from, the list does not constitute a final determination by EPA concerning the liability of any party for the release or threat of release of hazardous substances at the Site. We request that you consider becoming a "cooperating party" for the Lower Passaic River


Project. As a cooperating party, you, along with many other such parties, will be expected to fund EPA's share of the study costs. Upon completion of the study, it is expected that CERCLA and WRDA processes will be used to identify the required remediation and restoration programs, as well as the assignment of remediation and restoration costs. At this time, the commitments of the cooperating parties will apply only to the study. For those who choose not to cooperate, EPA may apply the CERCLA enforcement process, pursuant to Sections 106 (a) and 107(a) of CERCLA, 42 U.S.C. §9606(a) and §9607(a) and other laws.

Pursuant to CERCLA Section 113(k), EPA must establish an administrative record that contains documents that form the basis of EPA's decision on the selection of a response action for a site. The administrative record files, which contain the documents related to the response action selected for this Site are located at EPA's Region 2 office (290 Broadway, New York) on the 18th floor. You may call the Records Center at (212) 637-4308 to make an appointment to view the administrative record for the Lower Passaic River Project.

EPA will be holding a meeting with all PRPs on October 29, 2003 at 10:00 AM in Conference Room 27A at the Region 2 office. At that meeting, EPA will provide information about the actions taken to date in the Lower Passaic River, as well as plans for future activities. After the presentation, PRPs will be given the opportunity to caucus, and EPA will return to answer any questions that might be generated during the private session. Please be advised that due to increased security measures, all visitors need to be registered with the security desk in the lobby in order to gain entry to the office. In order to ensure a smooth arrival, you will need to provide EPA with a list of attendees no later than October 15, 2003.

EPA recommends that the cooperating parties select a steering committee to represent the group's interest as soon as possible, since EPA expects a funding commitment for the financing of the CERCLA share of the \$20 million study by mid-November 2003.
