Lesson Title: Food Irradiation: The Good, The Bad and The Ugly.

Grades: 7-12

Subjects: Language Arts and Science

Overview: Students will research and develop a five-paragraph essay stating their

position on food irradiation.

Objectives:

Students will conduct research using a variety of materials.

- Students will recognize how the prejudice of the author influences the content of the material.
- Students will take a position on a controversial topic.
- Students will write a five-paragraph essay supporting a given position on a controversial science topic. (GEPA skill)

Materials and Resources: Science journals, web sites and writing organizers.

- Students will research a given topic, such as food irradiation. Library time will be available.
- Students will find 3 articles giving both the positive and negative aspects of the given topic.
- Class discussion will take place about how the position of the author and the propaganda used in the writing affect the overall quality and accuracy of the information stated.
- After reading the articles, the student must fill out the attached organizer to determine the position the student will be taking. Eight facts per side must be listed.
- The essay will be written in the given five-paragraph format.
- Revision and editing will then take place.
- Final essay will be submitted for evaluation.
