AMENDMENT TO THE CAPE MAY COUNTY WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

Public Notice

Take notice that on **MAR 05 1998**, pursuant to the provisions of the New Jersey Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules (N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.4), an amendment to the Cape May County Water Quality Management Plan was adopted by the Department of Environmental Protection. This amendment expands the sewer service area of the Wildwood/Lower Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant to include the Willow Drive area in Lower Township. A total of 31 existing homes and four currently vacant lots are added to the sewer service area, with a flow of 9,825 gallons per day (gpd). The affected properties are: block 442, lots 1 through 20; block 443, lots 8 through 14; block 444, lots 12 through 19; and block 447, lot 6.02 and lots 9 through 14. Any sewer connection from the subject area is required to comply with the environmentally sensitive area grant condition applied to the Wildwood/Lower Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant. In addition to the inclusion of Willow Drive as sewer service area, the amendment also provides a wastewater flow of 9,800 gpd for the existing Del Camino Trailer Park.

This amendment represents only one part of the permit process and other issues will be addressed prior to final permit issuance. Additional issues which were not reviewed in conjunction with this amendment but which may need to be addressed may include, but are not limited to, the following: antidegradation; effluent limitations; water quality analysis; exact locations and designs of future treatment works (pump stations, interceptors, sewers, outfalls, wastewater treatment plants); and development in wetlands, flood prone areas, designated Wild and Scenic River areas, or other environmentally sensitive areas which are subject to regulation under Federal or State statutes or rules.
