ADOPTED AMENDMENT TO THE MONMOUTH COUNTY WATER QUALITY
MANAGEMENT PLAN

Public Notice


Take notice that on OCT 26 2001 , pursuant to the provisions of the New Jersey Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules (N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.4), an amendment to the Monmouth County Water Quality Management Plan was adopted by the Department of Environmental Protection (Department). This amendment, submitted by Millstone Center Associates, is for a project that consists of a retail shopping center to be located on lot 58 block 4.06 on the Trenton-Lakewood Road (Monmouth County Route 526) in the Carrs Tavern Section of Millstone Township, Monmouth County. The site is 9.54 acres and the shopping center will provide a total of 48,492 square feet of retail space and will include associated parking and other site improvements. The facility will discharge 6200 gpd onsite through an individual disposal system.

This proposed amendment was evaluated in accordance with Executive Order 109 (2000) and N.J.A.C. 7:15-5.18 and no EO 109 analyses were required as this proposed amendment is exempt pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:15-8.2(c) because of municipal approvals received prior to March 20, 2001.

This amendment proposal was noticed in the New Jersey Register on January 16, 2001 at 33 N.J.R. 330(b). No comments were received.

This amendment represents only one part of the permit process and other issues may need to be addressed prior to final permit issuance. Additional issues which may need to be addressed may include, but are not limited to, the following: antidegradation; effluent limitations; water quality analysis; exact locations and

designs of future treatment works (pump stations, interceptors, sewers, outfalls, wastewater treatment plants); and development in wetlands, flood prone areas, designated Wild and Scenic River areas, or other environmentally sensitive areas which are subject to regulation under Federal or State statutes or rules.
