
ADOPTED AMENDMENT TO THE MONMOUTH COUNTY WATER QUALITY
MANAGEMENT PLAN

Public Notice

Take notice that on MAR 14 2007, pursuant to the provisions of the New Jersey Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules (N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.4), an amendment to the Monmouth County Water Quality Management Plan was adopted by the Department of Environmental Protection (Department). This amendment was submitted on behalf of WAWA Food Market Number 909 located at Block 56, Lot 4 on Country Route 537, Millstone Township, Monmouth County. This amendment expands the existing gas station and convenience store by 2,472 square feet for a total of 8,004 square feet. The existing individual subsurface disposal system will also be expanded to handle the increase in wastewater flow demands. The flows associated with this WAWA will be expanded from 1,800 gallons per day (gpd) to 3,500 gpd.

This amendment proposal was noticed in the New Jersey Register on January 2, 2007 at 39 N.J.R. 109(a) and no comments were received during the comment period.

This amendment represents only one part of the permit process and other issues may need to be addressed prior to final permit issuance. Additional issues which may need to be addressed may include, but are not limited to, the following: compliance with stormwater regulations; antidegradation; effluent limitations; water quality analysis; exact locations and designs of future treatment works (pump stations, interceptors, sewers, outfalls, wastewater treatment plants); and development in wetlands, flood prone areas, designated Wild and Scenic River areas, or other environmentally sensitive areas which are subject to regulation under Federal or State statutes or rules.
