REVISION TO THE NORTHEAST WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

TAKE NOTICE that on **NOV 29 2000**, pursuant to the provisions of the Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules, N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.5, a revision to the Northeast Water Quality Management Plan was adopted by the Department. The revision modifies the Florham Park Sewerage Authority (FPSA) Wastewater Management Plan to address Lots 1 through 8, Block 9201 and Lots 3 through 7, Block 9202 along Arrowhead Road; Lot 2, Block 9202 and Lots 9 through 11, Block 9201 along Delaware Road; and Lot 12, Block 9201 along Park Avenue in Morris Township, Morris County. It also addresses Lots 3 through 9, Block 1101 on the north side of Punch Bowl Road and the west side of Park Avenue in Florham Park, Morris County. The revision is in response to a request made by FPSA to correct the failing septic systems in the above mentioned areas. This revision would transfer eighteen homes that are on septic systems from Morris Township to FPSA. These homes are located on 24.2 acres in the Delaware Road/Arrowhead Road area and would be allocated 5,400 gallons per day (gpd). Seven homes that are on septic systems in Florham Park in the Punch Bowl Road area would be transferred to the Morris Woodlands Sewage Treatment Plant (STP). These homes, located on 8.3 acres, would be allocated 2,100gpd.

This revision represents only one part of the permit process and other issues will be addressed prior to final permit issuance. Additional issues which were not reviewed in conjunction with this revision but which may need to be addressed may include, but are not limited to, the following: exact locations and designs of future treatment works (pump stations, interceptors, sewers, disposal beds); and development in wetlands, flood prone areas or other environmentally sensitive areas which are subject to regulation under federal or State statutes or rules.
