




REVISION TO THE NORTHEAST WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

TAKE NOTICE that on **NOV 13 2008**, pursuant to the provisions of the Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq, and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules, N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.5, a revision to the Northeast Water Quality Management Plan (WQMP) and West Milford Wastewater Management Plan (WMP) was adopted by the Department. This revision corrects/updates the Northeast WQMP and the West Milford WMP to identify the existing individual subsurface sewage disposal system (ISSDS) that is located on Block 15901, Lot 16 in West Milford Township, Passaic County, New Jersey. The existing ISSDS has a capacity of 3,500 gallons per day (gpd) and has been in existence since 1964 serving the Pine Village Inn, a restaurant/banquet hall. Philadelphia Church Ministries (Ministries) purchased the property in 1996 and used the existing structure as a church. Ministries obtained a Highlands Exemption Determination in October 2006 to expand the existing structure to house a school and other church related facilities. As per the settlement agreement between the Department and Ministries (Docket #ELUM-WM-09224-2207N) on the Highlands Exemption Determination and Water Quality Management Plan Consistency Determination, Ministries has obtained a New Jersey Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Sanitary Subsurface Sewage Disposal System General Permit (T-1 permit), NJG0172707. In addition to the expansion of the church structure a new ISSDS will be installed to serve the 450 seat church and 100 student school. The projected wastewater planning flow for the site calculated in accordance with N.J.A.C. 7:9A-7.4 is 3,350 gallons per day.

Since the site will remain regulated under a T1 permit this qualifies as a revision in accordance with N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.5(b)1i which states, the Department and the designated planning agencies shall prepare revisions to Statewide and areawide WQM plans to correct, clarify, or update erroneous, unclear, or outdated statements in Statewide and areawide WQM Plans regarding development and wastewater treatment facilities existing at the time of the most recently adopted areawide WQM plan or amendment affecting the site.
