



REVISION TO THE TRI-COUNTY WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

Take notice that on **AUG 04 1999**, pursuant to the provisions of the Water Quality Planning Act, N.J.S.A. 58:11A-1 et seq., and the Statewide Water Quality Management Planning rules, N.J.A.C. 7:15-3.5, a revision to the Tri-County Water Quality Management Plan was adopted by the Department.

This proposal revises the Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority (CCMUA) Wastewater Management Plan (WMP). The revision proposes to construct a restaurant, gas station and car wash in Winslow Township, Block 502, Lots 1 & 2. Winslow Township does not have enough capacity at its plant to accept flow for this site. This revision sends flow through an eight inch sewer main, located within Berlin-Cross Keys Road, which is owned and operated by the Gloucester Township Municipal Utility Authority (MUA). Flow will ultimately be conveyed to the CCMUA Del. No. 1 STP. A quad-party agreement between McDonald's, Amoco, Ross Fogg and Gloucester Township MUA has been completed.

This agreement establishes an interbasin transfer from the Atlantic Ocean Basin to the Delaware River basin. The total flow involved is 2040 gpd, which will be added to the 1.2 gpd flow cap already allotted to Winslow Township, Chesilhurst, and Waterford through a water supply policy between the Pinelands Commission and NJDEP's Bureau of Water Allocation. Pineland's has given their approval to add the 2040 gpd flow from this site to the 1.2 mgd flow cap to give a total interbasin transfer flow cap of 1.202 mgd.
