Defendant, Victoria Gebhard ("Defendant"), having been duly served with a copy of the Summons and Complaint in the above-entitled action and default having been defaulted for failure to appear, answer, or otherwise defend:

This Court now finds that Defendant violated the New Jersey Insurance Fraud Prevention Act ("Fraud Act"), specifically N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4(3) and -4a(4)(b), by presenting or causing to

be presented any written or oral statement as part of, or in support of, a claim for payment or other benefit pursuant to an insurance policy, knowing that the statement contains any false or misleading information concerning any fact or thing material to the claim.

The Court further finds that Defendant violated the Fraud Act, specifically N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4a(2), by preparing or making any written or oral statement that is intended to be presented to any insurance company in connection with, or in support of, any claim for payment or other benefit pursuant to an insurance policy knowing that the statement contains any false or misleading information concerning any fact or thing material to the claim.

The Court further finds that Defendant violated the Fraud Act, specifically N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4b, by knowingly assisting, conspiring with, or urging any person or practitioner to violate any of the provisions of the Fraud Act.

The Court further finds that Defendant violated the Fraud Act, specifically N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4c, by, due to assisting, conspiring, or urging of any person, knowingly benefiting, directly or indirectly, from the proceeds derived from a violation of Fraud Act.

FINAL JUDGMENT is on this 2 day of 2018, entered in the amount of \$8,323.50 against Defendant, Victoria Gebhard, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:6A-15, Defendant Victoria Gebhard's driving privileges shall be suspended for a period of one (1) year from the date of this judgment.
