Fitzgerald, Deputy Attorney General, appearing), attorney for Plaintiff, Marlene Caride, Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance on a motion for final judgment by default; and

Defendant, Carla Williams ("Defendant"), having been duly

served with a copy of the Summons and Complaint in the abovecaptioned action, and default having been entered Defendant's failure to appear, answer, or otherwise defend;

This Court now finds that Defendant violated the New Jersey Insurance Fraud Prevention Act, N.J.S.A. 17:33A-1 to -30 ("Fraud Act") by (i) concealing and/or knowingly failing to disclose the occurrence of an event which affects her initial or continued right or entitlement to any insurance benefit or payment to which she is entitled, and (ii) making a written statement to an insurance company for the purpose of obtaining an insurance policy, knowing that the statement contained false or misleading information concerning material facts.

Specifically, on an application for automobile insurance, Defendant failed to disclose that her husband was a household member and a driver of an insured vehicle, both in violation of N.J.S.A. 17:33A-4(a)(3) and -4(a)(4)(b); and

FINAL JUDGMENT is on this 14th day of May 2021, entered in the amount of \$8,580.00 against Defendant, and in favor of Plaintiff, Marlene Caride, Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance. This amount consists of \$5,000.00 in civil penalties for one violation of the Fraud Act, N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b); attorneys' fees of \$2,580.00 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5(b); and a statutory fraud surcharge of \$1,000.00 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:33A-5.1.
