
AMENDED ORDER

THIS MATTER being opened to the Court, on March 21, 2023, by Richard E. Wegryn, Jr., Deputy Attorney General, attorney for Plaintiff, Marlene Caride, Commissioner of the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance for an Amended Order granting attorney fees;

IT IS on this 21st day of March 2023, **ORDERED** as follows:

1. Plaintiff's motion for Summary Judgment is **GRANTED**;
2. Plaintiff's request for attorney fees shall be reduced to \$1,000.00 and entered against Defendant Hana M. Coleman and in favor of Plaintiff Marlene Caride;
3. Final Judgment is entered in the amount of \$6,000.00 against Defendant Hana M. Coleman and in favor of Plaintiff Marlene Caride;
4. Defendant's driving privileges shall be suspended for a period of one (1) year from the date of this judgment; and
