THIS MATTER, having been opened by the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance ("Commissioner"), State of New Jersey, upon issuance of Order to Show Cause No. E17-11 alleging that James D. Griffin ("Griffin" or "Respondent") may have violated various provisions of the insurance laws of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Griffin was licensed as nonresident individual insurance producer in the State of New Jersey, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-34, until his license expired on September 30, 2014; and

WHEREAS, Griffin is subject to the provisions of the New Jersey Insurance Producer Licensing Act of 2001, N.J.S.A. 17:22A-26 et seq. ("Producer Act"), and the regulations

governing Insurance Producer Standards of Conduct, N.J.A.C. 11:17C-1.1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 11:17D-1.1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-40a(2), an insurance producer shall not violate any insurance law, regulation, subpoena, or order of the Commissioner or of another state's insurance regulator; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-40a(8), an insurance producer shall not use fraudulent, coercive or dishonest practices, or demonstrate incompetence, untrustworthiness or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of insurance business in this State or elsewhere; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-40d, the Commissioner shall retain the authority to enforce the provisions of and impose any penalty or remedy authorized by the Producer Act and Title 17 of the Revised Statutes or Title 17B of the New Jersey Statutes against any person who is under investigation for or charged with a violation of the Producer Act or Title 17 of the Revised Statutes or Title 17B of the New Jersey statutes, even if the person's license or registration has been surrendered or has lapsed by operation of law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 11:17C-2.2(a), all premium funds shall be remitted to the insurer or other insurance producer, as applicable, within five business days after receipt of the funds, with certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner issued Order to Show Cause E17-11 on March 10, 2017 alleging violations of New Jersey insurance laws by Respondent as set forth in the following Count:

COUNT 1

IT APPEARING, that from October 13, 2012 through October 13, 2013, New Jersey consumer "JM" held a commercial liability insurance policy with Colony Insurance Company ("Colony"); and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, Respondent, on behalf of insurance brokerage Excel Insurance Services ("Excel"), sold JM the Colony commercial liability policy; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, that on or about September 16, 2013, Excel provided to Respondent an insurance renewal quote for JM's Colony commercial policy; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, that the insurance premium quote for the renewal totaled \$940.00 for one year of coverage; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, that JM's policy was inforce at the time of the renewal quote was scheduled to expire on October 13, 2013; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, that Respondent communicated with JM regarding the policy renewal and impending policy expiration; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, that on October 13, 2013, JM's insurance policy with Colony lapsed for non-payment; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, that on October 16, 2013, Respondent provided JM with an invoice for the renewal policy with effective dates of coverage of October 13, 2013 through October 13, 2014; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, that on December 5, 2013 JM's bank account was debited for \$940.00 payable to Respondent; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, that in or around March of 2014, JM contacted Excel inquiring about the status of his commercial liability insurance policy; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, that in or around March of 2014, Excel stated to JM that Colony did not have an insurance policy in-force with JM at that time because Excel did not receive a request to bind the policy and did not receive a renewal premium; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, that in or around March of 2014, JM demanded Respondent return to him the \$940.00 insurance premium; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, that on or about March 24, 2014, Respondent returned JM's \$940.00 insurance premium by means of a check from Respondent's trust account; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, that this instance where Respondent failed to remit JM's insurance premium to the insurer within five business days after receipt of the funds constitutes violations of N.J.S.A. 17:22A-40a(2) and (8), and N.J.A.C. 11:17C-2.2(a); and

WHEREAS, as set forth in the Certification of Deputy Attorney General Ryan S. Schaffer ("Schaffer Certification"), attached hereto as Exhibit "A," Griffin was given notice of the aforesaid charges and an opportunity to contest the charges at a hearing pursuant to Order to Show Cause E17-11, which was served on Griffin by certified and regular mail at his business and mailing address, according to records maintained by the Department of Banking and Insurance ("Department") in accordance with N.J.A.C. 11:17D-2.1(a)3, and after the regular and certified mail to such address was returned, service was effectively made at the address shown on this Final Order as evidenced by the signed return receipt attached as Exhibit 3 to the Schaffer Certification and by the fact that after being served, Griffin contacted counsel for the Department and attempted to negotiate a settlement of this matter; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING, Griffin failed to provide written responses to the charges contained in Order to Show Cause E17-11 within 20 days as provided by N.J.A.C. 11:17D-2.1(d)1, and therefore Griffin has waived his right to a hearing to contest these charges and the charges are deemed admitted, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 11:17D-2.1(b)1;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS on this day of Section 8 72. 2017

ORDERED, that the charges contained in Count 1 of Order to Show Cause E17-11 are deemed admitted by Griffin, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 11:17D-2.1(b)1; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-40, and N.J.A.C. 11:17D-2.1(b)(2), the nonresident insurance producer license of Griffin is hereby **REVOKED**; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-45c, Griffin shall pay a fine in the amount of \$5,000.00 to the Department; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-45c, Respondent shall be responsible for the reimbursement to the Commissioner of the costs of investigation totaling \$325.00, as evidenced by the Certification of Albert N. Verdel, attached hereto as Exhibit "B"; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that Griffin shall pay the above fines and costs in full by remitting payment to the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance, State of New Jersey, 20 West State Street, P.O. Box 329, Trenton, New Jersey 08625, Attention: Virgil Dowtin, Chief of Investigations, by certified check, cashier's check or money order made payable to the "State of New Jersey, General Treasury," within ten days from the date of service of this Order; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that in the event full payment of the fines and costs are not made, the Commissioner may exercise any and all remedies available by law, including but not limited to recovery of any unpaid penalties, in accordance with the Penalty Enforcement Law of 1999, N.J.S.A. 2A:58-10 et seq.; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the fine and costs in this Final Order are imposed pursuant to the police powers of the State of New Jersey for the enforcement of the law and the protection of the public health, safety and welfare, and are not intended to constitute debts which may be limited or discharged in a bankruptcy proceeding; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the provisions of this Final Order represent a final agency decision and constitute a final resolution of the allegations contained in Order to Show Cause No. E17-11.

- 8. The certified mailing to Respondent was signed by Respondent. [Attached as Exhibit 3 is a true and correct copy of the signed Certified Mailing Return Receipt].
- 9. On April 19, 2017, Respondent called my office, confirmed receipt of the Order to Show Cause, and requested to settle the Order to Show Cause via Consent Order.
- 10. During the April 19, 2017 telephone call Respondent did not request a hearing.
- 11. Respondent did not file or otherwise provide an Answer to the Order to Show Cause.
- 12. On July 24, 2017, I mailed to Respondent, via UPS overnight mail, a copy of a Consent Order with instructions to sign and return the document within seven days. [Attached as Exhibit 4 is a true and correct copy of the July 24, 2017 letter (without the attached Consent Order), and the UPS proof of delivery].
- 13. Respondent did not return the Consent Order or contact me by any means regarding the July 24, 2017 letter.
- 14. On August 10, 2017, I mailed to Respondent, via UPS overnight mail, a letter enclosing a copy of the Order to Show Cause and Consent Order with instructions to return the signed

Consent Order within 20 days, or provide an answer to the Order to Show Cause within 20 days. [Attached as Exhibit 5 is a true and accurate copy of the August 10, 2017 letter (without the enclosure), and a copy of the UPS proof of delivery].

- 15. Respondent did not return the Consent Order or contact me by any means regarding the July 24, 2017 letter.
- 16. Respondent has not filed or otherwise provided an Answer to the Order to Show Cause with the 20 days provided by N.J.A.C. 11:17D-2.1(d)1.
- 17. Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 11:17D-2.1(a), Respondent was lawfully served with the Order to Show Cause on April 4, 2017.
- 18. To date, Respondent has not filed an answer nor requested a hearing to contest the allegations set forth in Order to Show Cause No. E17-11.

Allegations of this Order to Show Cause not answered in the manner set forth above shall be deemed to have been admitted; and
- (D) A statement requesting a hearing.

We represent the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance ("Department"). On March 10, 2017, the Commissioner of the Department of Banking and Insurance issued Order to Show Cause No. E17-11 charging you with various violations of the insurance laws and regulations of the State of New Jersey. The Order to Show Cause orders you to appear and show cause as to why your insurance producer license should not be suspended or revoked and why other administrative fines and costs should not be imposed against you. On April 8, 2017, the Order to Show Cause was served on you via regular and certified mail.



- 2. This certification is submitted in support of the Department's application for reimbursement of its costs of

- 3. On April 10, 2014, former Investigators Linda Gleghorn and Christian Traum were assigned responsibility for determining whether James D. Griffin may have violated certain provisions of the New Jersey Insurance Producer Licensing Act of 2001, N.J.S.A. 17:22A-26, et seq. ("Producer Act"), and their investigation resulted in the issuance of Order to Show Cause E17-11.
- 4.
