This matter, having been opened by the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance ("Commissioner"), State of New Jersey, upon information that Lily C. Lam ("Respondent"), licensed as a resident individual insurance producer, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-32, may have violated various provisions of the insurance laws of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Respondent is subject to the provisions of New Jersey Insurance Producer Licensing Act of 2001, N.J.S.A. 17:22A-26 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-40a (2) an insurance producer shall not violate any insurance laws, or violate any regulation, subpoena or order of the Commissioner or of another state's insurance regulator; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17:22A-40a (8) an insurance producer shall not use fraudulent, coercive, or dishonest practices, or demonstrate incompetence, untrustworthiness or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of insurance business in this State; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 11:17A-4.2, in cases where an applicant's signature is required, an insurance producer who takes an application for insurance shall be required to

witness the signature of the prospective insured on the application prior to the submission of the application to the insurer; and

WHEREAS, on August 7, 2015, the Respondent was an actively licensed New Jersey resident insurance producer; and

WHEREAS, on August 7, 2015, the Respondent, submitted a copy of applicant GM's signed Life Insurance Product Feature Comparison ("LIPFC") form from a previously submitted insurance application for GM to Prudential Insurance Company as a real and true signature on a LIPFC for a subsequent and additional insurance application, in violation of N.J.S.A. 17:22A-40a (2), (8), and (10) and N.J.A.C. 11:17A-4.2; and

WHEREAS, Respondent:

- 1) Has admitted responsibility for the aforementioned violations; and
- 2) Has cooperated fully with the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance's investigation; and

WHEREAS, Respondent has waived her right to a hearing on the aforementioned violations and has consented to the payment of a fine in the amount of \$2,500.00; and

WHEREAS, this matter should be resolved upon the consent of the parties without resort to a formal hearing; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS on this day of

2016.

IT IS ORDERED AND AGREED, that said fine shall be paid by certified check, cashier's check or money order made payable to the State of New Jersey, General Treasury in one payment of \$2,500.00 due and payable immediately upon the execution of this Consent Order by the Respondent; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND AGREED that the signed Consent Order together

with the payment of \$2,500.00 shall be remitted to:

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND AGREED, that the provisions of this Consent

Order represent a final agency decision and constitute a final resolution of the violations

contained herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND AGREED, that the Respondent shall cease and desist

from engaging in the conduct that gave rise to this Consent Order.
