ORDER TO AMEND DATES OF PUBLICATION OF ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE WITH CONTINUATION OF RESTRAINTS AS TO WHY AN ORDER OF LIQUIDATION SHOULD NOT BE ENTERED

This matter having been opened to the Court by Christopher S. Porrino, Attorney General of New Jersey, by Brian R. Fitzgerald, Deputy Attorney General, as attorney for plaintiff, Richard J. Badolato, the Commissioner of the Department of Banking and Insurance of the State of New Jersey ("Commissioner"), and Rehabilitator of Freelancers Consumer Operated and Oriented Program of New Jersey d/b/a Health Republic Insurance of New Jersey ("Freelancers"), for an order amending the dates of publication of the December 19, 2016

)

Order to Show Cause why an order of liquidation should not be entered as to Freelancers; and

WHEREAS, on December 15, 2016, the Commissioner filed a Petition of Liquidation and supporting documents with the court; and

WHEREAS, on December 19, 2016, the court issued an Order to Show Cause, returnable February 24, 2017, as to why an Order of Liquidation should not be entered; and

WHEREAS, on December 30, 2016, the Commissioner filed a motion to accelerate the return date of the Order to Show Cause; and

WHEREAS, the court set the Commissioner's acceleration motion down for a hearing on the papers on January 20, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the Order to Show Cause provided that notice of the Commissioner's application for an Order of Liquidation be published in various newspapers on or before January 20, 2017, and to be repeated once a week thereafter for two successive weeks; and

WHEREAS, publication of such notice while the Commissioner's acceleration motion remains pending will likely result in undue confusion to the public; and

WHEREAS, as set forth in the documents filed in support of the Commissioner's acceleration motion, insureds, health care providers, and vendors are aware that Freelancers is insolvent, has been placed into rehabilitation, and is in a hazardous financial condition; and

WHEREAS, additional publications in the various newspapers of notice of the Commissioner's application for an order of liquidation will cause an increased expense for the Freelancers estate, with a small likelihood of increased actual notice to interested parties or the public; and for good cause appearing,

IT IS on this /8 day of January, 2017, ORDERED:

- Paragraph 3 of the December 19, 2016 Order to Show
   Cause entered by this court is hereby amended as follows:
- "3. Notice of this application to any other interested parties shall be accomplished by publishing a copy of this Order in a newspaper of general circulation in the county within which Freelancers's corporate offices are located, specifically, the Newark Star-Ledger, the Courier-Post, and the New Jersey Law Journal, on or before January 27, 2017. Such notice shall constitute good and sufficient service of this application to all persons having an interest in or claim against Freelancers subject to the requirements of due process of law."
- 3. A copy of this Order shall be served upon counsel for Freelancers and counsel for the New Jersey Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association, and also published on the Department of Banking and Insurance's website at:
