






Why is DRBC developing a Water Resources Resilience Plan?

- 14 m+ people rely on our shared waters
- 13,539 sq. mi. watershed
- 4 states
- 330 river miles
- 130 miles tidally influenced

Finding: Climate change is impacting the Basin's water cycle



The Water Resources Resilience Plan (WRRP) will inform DRBC actions and activities to prepare and adapt the Basin's shared water resources to withstand the known and potential impacts of climate change and other hazards.



What are potential action areas for the Water Resources Resilience Plan?

- oFlow and drought management
- Flooding
- Water quality
- Water use and efficiency
- Water equity




