New Jersey Student Learning Assessment-Adaptive (NJSLA-A)

Designed to help families and educators understand student progress, the NJSLA-A is aligned to the New Jersey Student Learning Standards to support educators and students.



Why is the Assessment given?

- Demonstrates students' knowledge and skills as aligned with the New Jersey Student Learning Standards
- Provides a common, statewide measure of student learning required by state and federal law
- Empowers families and communities with clear information about individual progress and school- and district-level performance



Which Grades and Subjects are tested?

- English Language Arts (ELA) Grades 3-9
- Mathematics Grades 3-8, Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II



What does the Test look like?

- **Format:** Computer-based test given on district-supplied devices
- **Questions:** A mix of multiple choice, writing, and interactive tasks (like drag-and-drop)
- **Student support:** Built-in tools and accommodations based on a student's individualized learning plan



What will Families receive?

- **Individual student report:** Results from the NJSLA-A to help communication between schools and families
- **Achievement level:** Indicates whether the student is meeting grade-level expectations
- **Reporting categories:** Show how your child performed on different parts of the test



How are Results used?

- Supports schools in evaluating curriculum and refining instruction, while contributing to statewide efforts to identify schools and districts that may require additional support
- Identifies areas in the tested subjects where an individual student may need additional support or enrichment
- Provides public reporting through New Jersey School and District Performance Reports, showing how students and schools are performing compared to statewide expectations
