



## ANTICIPATION GUIDE

1. In the US, between 1980 and 2009, the number of school-age children who spoke another language in the home increased, from 4.7 million to 11.2 million .
2. In New Jersey, approximately 5 out of 6 school districts/charter schools enroll ELLs.
3. As of October 15, 2014, there were 70,120 (number) ELLs in NJ. The number of ELLs has increased by approximately 15,000 (number) students in the last 5 years.
4. According to the 2013 biennial Title III report, New Jersey had the forth highest number of recent immigrants in the United States.
5. 2,680 unaccompanied immigrant youth were released to sponsors in NJ from October 2013 to September 2014.
6. In New Jersey, on the 2014 11<sup>th</sup> grade English language arts assessment, there was a 54 % achievement gap between ELLs and their English speaking peers.
7. Acquiring academic English language skills often requires 4 to 7 years.



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
