I am pleased to announce that the New Jersey Department of Education in collaboration with the Garden State Partnership for Teacher Quality, which includes Kean, Rowan and William Paterson Universities, is co-sponsoring an open house at the nine schools designated as New Jersey Schools to Watch® (NJSTW) on October 6, 2010. The NJSTW have been recognized by the department for their high quality academic programs and active support of student development. This event will provide an opportunity for administrators, teachers and other faculty to visit these schools and learn more about their exemplary programs and practices for addressing the needs of young adolescents. The nine schools are located in the three regions of the state.

I would also like to remind you that applications for the 2010-11 NJSTW middle grades improvement program are due to the department no later than 4:00 pm on October 15, 2010. All applications must be submitted online to the department via NJDOE Homeroom at http://homeroom.state.nj.us/. The application process is the first step towards designation as a NJSTW and becoming part of a state and national network of schools dedicated to educating young adolescents. NJSTW focuses on schools with students in grades six, seven and/or eight and must contain one of these grades in order to participate.
