This memo provides districts with information about the upcoming evaluation data submission, as well as reminders to consider while planning for the 2020-21 school year.

Upcoming Educator Evaluation Data Submission

- Governor Murphy's <u>Executive Order 117</u> waived the use of student growth data as a measure of educator effectiveness in the overall evaluation of any educator for the 2019-20 school year. Therefore, observations will make up 100 percent of summative scores for <u>qualifying Teachers, Principals, Assistant</u> <u>Principals and Vice Principals</u>.
- Between July 1 and August 1, 2020, authorized district personnel will access the streamlined Evaluation Information System (EIS) through the New Jersey Department of Education's <u>Homeroom webpage</u>, where districts will submit, verify and certify all 2019-20 educator evaluation scores to the state.
- In addition, authorized district personnel will complete the required Annual Evaluation Survey.
- The data submission through the streamlined EIS will be a similar process to the one that districts are familiar with, but a few key changes relevant to this school year are included here:
 - Districts will submit final scores for *all* educators required to receive a summative rating for 2019-20 school year, during the submission scheduled between July 1 and August 1. Because no mSGP will be calculated, there will not be a fall submission.
 - This year's educator evaluation data submission must include the role of the educator.
 - For every educator receiving a summative rating, the district will need to select a reason they are receiving a score, from a drop-down list of available responses.
 - Districts will be asked to indicate if there are educators in the district currently on a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) not receiving a summative rating (1.00-4.00) for the 2019-20 school year.
- The Staff Evaluation Submission Data Element Guidebook outlines acceptable values for populating the spreadsheet.
- The Technical Manual includes the step-by-step process for upload.
- Both the updated Staff Evaluation Submission Data Element Guidebook and the Technical Manual can be accessed through Homeroom once you enter the EIS portal.

Important Reminders

Dates to Remember:

- August 31 School Improvement Panels must be in place in each school
- October 1 All teaching staff members must be notified of policies and procedures related to evaluation
- October 31 All SGOs, Administrator Goals and Professional Development Plans must be in place for 2020-21.
- October 31 Corrective Action Plans (for those educators remaining on CAPs initiated in School Year 2019-20) must be in place for 2020-21 (or within 25 working days of receiving summative score for mSGP teachers and principals)

Required trainings: Prior to beginning observations, districts must provide refresher evaluation training for returning evaluators and teachers, and in-depth role-related training for new staff.
