Substitute Teacher Service Limits Update for Districts

On January 11, 2021, Governor Murphy signed Executive Order 214. Given that the COVID-19 public health emergency has led to an increase in teaching vacancies and disruptions in the continuity of instruction, the Executive Order extends the number of days certificated individuals serving in an instructional area outside of their credentials may fill vacant teaching positions.

Certificate of Eligibility (CE); Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standing (CEAS) not in subject area of classroom placement; and Standard certification not in subject area of classroom placement	 Prior to EO 214: <i>CE and CEAS</i>: 20 instructional days, extendable to 40 instructional days <i>Standard</i>: 40 instructional days Temporary Extension Under EO 214: <i>CE, CEAS, and Standard</i>: 40 instructional days, extendable to 60 instructional days 	Temporary Extension Under EO 214: School district must notify the Executive County Superintendent using the <u>COVID-19 Public Health</u> Emergency Substitute Service Limit Extension Form if individual substitutes in the same classroom for more than 40 days. The school district must demonstrate that despite efforts, the district could not hire an appropriately certificated teacher within the 40-day period and that the individual serving as substitute is subject to periodic monitoring by a supervisor.
CE or CEAS in subject area of classroom placement	 Can be extended from 60 instructional days to up to one academic year in the same classroom; for an extension beyond 60 days, CEAS and CE substitutes must: Have a provisional certificate; Be enrolled in or have completed a mentoring program; and Be enrolled in or have completed CE or CEAS educator preparation program. 	School district must notify the Executive County Superintendent if individual substitutes in the same classroom for more than 60 days.

Standard certificate in subject area of classroom area where substitute is placed Can be extended from 60 instructional days to up to one academic year.

School district must notify the Executive County Superintendent if individual substitutes in the same classroom for more than 60 days.

New Online Substitute Application Process

Additionally, to facilitate a smoother and more efficient application process, the NJDOE is announcing amendments to the substitute teacher application process for school districts and applicants. Effective on February 10, 2021, all substitute credential applicants must initiate their applications online through the New Jersey Teacher Certification Information System (TCIS). A Guide for Applicants: How to Apply for a Substitute Credential provides detailed information on completing the online application. Once the applicant applies online, the appropriate County Office of Education shall assist with the approval of the substitute credential application in TCIS.

Reminder

A substitute teacher is a certificated individual assigned to temporarily fill a position, whether it be a vacancy caused by retirement or resignation, or a temporary leave due to a short- or long-term absence of the assigned teacher. The NJDOE has many certificate options that allow for service as a substitute teacher. An individual is qualified to serve as a substitute teacher, with varying service limits depending on the type of credential or certification, if he/she/they hold at least one of the following:

- substitute credential;
- certificate of eligibility (CE);
- certificate of eligibility with advanced standing (CEAS);
- standard certificate in any instructional area;
- educational services certificate; or
- administrative certificate.
