## School Safety Specialist Training to Be Held in January

The New Jersey Department of Education's four-day School Safety Specialist (SSS) certification training will be held Tuesdays in January; January 10, 17, 24, and 31, 2023, at the Morris County Public Safety Training Academy, 500 West Hanover Avenue, Morristown.

To attend the training and receive the School Safety Specialist certification, candidates must:

- Be a school administrator or a school employee with expertise in school safety and security;
- Be an employee of a Local Education Agency (LEA) designated by the Chief School Administrator;
- Complete Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Introduction to the Incident Command System, IS-100.C, online course; and
- Complete all four days of training sessions.

Prior to attending the training program, SSS designees should complete the FEMA online course [IS-100.C Introduction to the Incident Command System, ICS 100](#). This online prerequisite for the SSS training program takes approximately two hours to complete. Per [N.J.S.A 18A:17-43.3](#), responsibilities of the SSS include supervising and providing oversight for all school safety and security personnel; ensuring safety and security policies and procedures comply with state laws and regulations; and, providing the necessary training and resources to LEAs in matters relating to school safety and security. The SSS will also serve as the LEA's liaison with local law enforcement, as well as national, state and community agencies and organizations, in matters of school safety and security.
