School Safety Specialist Training to Be Held in June

The New Jersey Department of Education's four-day School Safety Specialist (SSS) certification training program will be held on June 27 through June 30, 2022, at the Middlesex County Fire Academy, 1001 Fire Academy Drive, Sayreville.

To attend the training and receive the School Safety Specialist certification, candidates must:

- Be a school administrator or a school employee with expertise in school safety and security;
- Be a district employee designated by the school district superintendent;
- Complete FEMA's Introduction to the Incident Command System, IS-100.C, online course; and
- Complete all four days of training sessions.

Prior to attending the training program, SSS designees should complete the FEMA online course [IS-100.C Introduction to the Incident Command System, ICS 100](#). This online prerequisite for the SSS training program takes approximately two hours to complete. Per [N.J.S.A 18A:17-43.3](#), responsibilities of the SSS include supervising and providing oversight for all school safety and security personnel; ensuring safety and security policies and procedures comply with state laws and regulations; and providing the necessary training and resources to school district staff in matters relating to school safety and security. The SSS will also serve as the district's liaison with local law enforcement, as well as national, state and community agencies and organizations, in matters of school safety and security.
