## Computer Science Education Week (CSEdWeek)

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) invites New Jersey school districts to join in celebrating Computer Science Education Week (CSEdWeek) the week of December 5 to 9, 2022. CSEdWeek is an annual week-long celebration to inspire K-12 students to learn Computer Science, advocate for equitable Computer Science education for all students, and celebrate contributions to the field of Computer Science.

- The first CSEdWeek was launched the week of December 6 to 9, 2009 through a collaboration of professional, federal, corporate, and nonprofit organizations to coincide with the birthday of the Computer Scientist, [Admiral Grace Hopper](#). Admiral Grace Hopper contributed to the development of word-based programming languages which accelerated the development of business applications.
- Code.org launched the first Hour of Code event on December 9, 2013. The Hour of Code started as a one-hour introduction to Computer Science to emphasize that anyone can learn Computer Science and to broaden participation in the field.

The theme of CSEdWeek 2022 is *Celebrating Progress* to highlight the progress that has been made in Computer Science over the last decade. The hashtag #CelebratingProgress is being used on social media to promote the great CSEdWeek activities taking place in schools across the country. School districts can join the celebration by:

- Hosting an Hour of Code or similar event during CSEdWeek. Resources are available on the [CSEdWeek](#) and [Hour of Code](#) websites.
- Completing this short [CSEdWeek 2022 District Activities Survey](#) with information about CSEdWeek events hosted in the districts. The information will be included in a heat map of New Jersey displaying the names and locations of schools hosting CSEdWeek events and posted on social media.
- Sharing CSEdWeek activities hosted by their schools on social media utilizing hashtags #CompSciNJ and #CelebratingProgress.
- Registering and attending the webinar, [Computer Science Education in New Jersey: Celebrating Progress](#), on Monday, December 5, 2022, from 11 a.m. to 12 p.m. The webinar will highlight progress made in Computer Science education and existing Computer Science education programs in New Jersey's schools.
