## **Earth Day 2023 Celebrations**

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) invites New Jersey local education agencies (LEAs) to join in celebrating Earth Day 2023 on April 22<sup>nd</sup> and throughout the entire week of April 17- 22, 2023.

## **Background**

Earth Day is an annual event held on April 22<sup>nd</sup> to demonstrate support for environmental protection. First held on April 22, 1970, Earth Day now includes a wide range of events coordinated globally by <a href="EarthDay.org">EarthDay.org</a> and countless other organizations in engaging 1 billion people in more than 193 countries. The theme of Earth Day 2023 is *Invest in Our Planet*, focused on engaging governments, institutions, businesses, and individuals to do their part.

New Jersey has a <u>multi-faceted plan</u> to address and mitigate the impacts of climate change, which includes the implementation of educational initiatives. Through continued support and advocacy for climate change initiatives by Governor Murphy and First Lady Tammy Murphy, New Jersey became the first state in the nation to incorporate climate change education across its K-12 learning standards in June 2020.

Climate change will have the greatest impact on the youngest generations, which means schools have the opportunity and the responsibility to educate the children of today about this important issue and help them become transformative climate action leaders. Schools can teach students how to reduce our impacts on the environment, and can teach the next generation how to be environmental stewards. Climate awareness education, coupled with strong civic education, will foster new job opportunities, build a green consumer market, and allow citizens to engage with governments in a meaningful way to address climate change.
