#### Climate Week 2023

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) invites New Jersey Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) to participate in Climate Week 2023 from September 17-24, 2023.

### **Background**

<u>Climate Week</u> is the largest annual climate event of its kind, bringing together hundreds of events and activities across New York City in partnership with the United Nations. Each year, business leaders, political change makers, and civil society representatives of all ages and backgrounds, from all over the world, gather to drive the transition, speed up progress, and champion change that is already happening in the transition to a net zero carbon emissions future. This year's theme is, "We Can. We Will." New Jersey continues to be a proud participant in Climate Week.

New Jersey has a <u>multi-faceted plan</u> to address and mitigate the impacts of climate change, which includes the implementation of educational initiatives. Through continued support and advocacy for climate change initiatives by Governor Murphy and First Lady Tammy Murphy, New Jersey became the first state in the nation to incorporate climate change education in seven out of nine content areas in the K-12 New Jersey Student Learning Standards (NJSLS) in <u>June 2020</u>.
