

# Dynamic Learning Maps: Instructionally Embedded Fall 2023 Assessment Window

To assist educators in the identification of students' specific needs, Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) and the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) are offering the use of DLM's instructionally embedded (IE) assessments in fall of 2023 for students with significant intellectual disabilities. The DLM IE assessments may be used by teachers to better understand their student's instructional needs for the 2023-2024 school year. The DLM IE assessments are aligned to Essential Elements on which the student's 2023-2024 instruction will be based and can be used to gather baseline data and guide instruction. Use of the DLM IE assessments is available at no cost, is completely optional, and has no impact on the required year-end, summative DLM assessment.

It is important to note that the DLM IE assessments are separate and distinct from the year-end, summative assessment administered each spring. Results from the DLM IE assessments should be used to guide and inform instruction. They do not predict how well students will do on testlets taken during the spring assessment window, nor do they predict students' summative results.

# DLM Fall 2023 IE Window: September 11 to December 22, 2023

New Jersey districts may access the DLM IE assessments through the Educator Portal as one way to support students and teachers. The DLM IE assessments must be completed in-person; there is no remote option for administration.

### **DLM Fall IE Administration Guidance**

DLM has issued <u>guidance</u> to assist in the administration of the DLM IE assessments. # **DLM Fall IE Window Test Administration Training**

The DLM-developed test administrator training for the DLM IE assessment administration is now available. To access the DLM IE assessments, test administrators will be required to go through online training as they are required to do for the regular spring assessment window, but with an additional module regarding use of the DLM IE assessments.
