## K-12 Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management Teams Guidelines

On August 1, 2022, Governor Phil Murphy signed into law <u>N.J.S.A. 18A:17-43.4</u>, requiring the establishment of a multi-disciplinary threat assessment team in each public school, charter school, and renaissance school project. The purpose of a threat assessment team is to provide teachers, administrators, and other staff with assistance in identifying students with behaviors of concern, assessing those students' risk for engaging in violence or other harmful activities, and delivering intervention strategies to manage the risk of harm for students who pose a potential safety risk.

The law also requires the board of education of each school district and the board of trustees of each charter school or renaissance school project to develop and adopt a policy for the establishment of a multi-disciplinary threat assessment team at each school. Any policy developed by a school district, charter school or renaissance school project concerning the establishment of a multi-disciplinary threat assessment team must be aligned with the *Guidance on the Establishment and Training of K-12 Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management Teams* (BTAM), developed by the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) in consultation with the New Jersey Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness and State law enforcement agencies.

In order to fulfill its role in the establishment and training of K-12 BTAM teams, the NJDOE Office of School Preparedness and Emergency Planning (OSPEP) is providing ongoing Basic Training, Advanced Training, and General Awareness sessions for BTAM teams and school communities through the U.S. Department of Justice's Bureau of Justice Assistance Students, Teachers, and Officers Preventing School Violence Act grant program.
