

Autism Awareness Month

Every April, schools throughout New Jersey participate in schoolwide and community activities to commemorate Autism Awareness Month. In support and recognition of students with autism spectrum disorder (ASD), the New Jersey Department of Education's (NJDOE) Office of Special Education (OSE) is promoting awareness of ASD during the month of April as an opportunity for educators, students, and parents to learn more about ASD.

The Office of Special Education has created a theme to help encourage and support ASD awareness in schools. This year's theme for Autism Awareness Month is *Colors of My World*. The theme encourages schools to take part in fostering ASD awareness to promote understanding and acceptance for individuals with ASD in their schools and surrounding communities. It also encourages schools to celebrate the diversity, and unique contributions individuals with ASD make daily in the classroom.
