School Safety Specialist Training to Be Held in October/November

The New Jersey Department of Education's four-day School Safety Specialist (SSS) certification training will be held on October 19 and 26, and November 9 and 13, 2023, at the Bergen County Police and Fire Academy, 281 Campgaw Road, Mahwah, New Jersey 07430.

To attend the training and receive the School Safety Specialist certification, candidates must:

- Be a school administrator or a school employee with expertise in school safety and security;
- Be an employee of a local educational agency (LEA) designated by the Chief School Administrator;
- Complete Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Introduction to the Incident Command System, IS-100.C, online course; and,
- Complete all four days of training sessions.

Register online for this training. There is no cost to attend this training.

Prior to attending the training program, SSS designees should complete the FEMA online course <u>IS-100.C</u> <u>Introduction to the Incident Command System, ICS 100</u>. This online prerequisite for the SSS training program takes approximately two hours to complete. Before taking the online FEMA course, please review the <u>Technical System Requirements</u> at the bottom of the webpage. Pursuant to N.J.S.A 18A:17-43.3, responsibilities of the SSS include the supervision and oversight for all school safety and security personnel; ensuring safety and security policies and procedures comply with state laws and regulations; and, providing necessary training and resources to LEAs in matters relating to school safety and security. The SSS will also serve as the LEA's liaison with local law enforcement, along with national, state and community agencies and organizations.
