Release of the 2022-2023 School Performance Reports

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) is excited to publicly release the 2022-2023 New Jersey School Performance Reports. The reports may be found on the NJDOE's School Performance Report website.

The School Performance Reports reflect the NJDOE's commitment to providing parents, students, and school communities with a large variety of information about each school and local education agency (LEA). While these reports do not fully capture the unique circumstances and efforts of each school community, the NJDOE believes that it is critical to use the available data in the reports, along with other information collected directly within each LEA and community, to start conversations, identify gaps in information, and continue to find ways to ensure all students receive the support and resources that they need.

Important Notes about the 2022-2023 Reports

The 2022-2023 School Performance Reports include all data that was previously reported prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, which includes all assessment, student growth, and accountability data. As data over the last several years was impacted by the pandemic in various ways, the NJDOE recommends caution in comparing data from year to year.

The initial release of the School Performance Reports will not include postsecondary enrollment rates, because additional time was needed to finalize the postsecondary enrollment rates for the 2022-2023 school year. The NJDOE expects to release that data in the coming months.

What's New in the 2022-2023 School Performance Reports

The 2022-2023 School Performance Reports include changes that respond to stakeholder feedback, federal and state requirements, and data availability. These changes include:

- Reporting **student growth data** as measured by median student growth percentile for the first time since the 2018-2019 reports;
- Expanded **computer science course participation data** showing participation for all grades kindergarten through 12;
- New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment (NJGPA) results; and
- Results from the fall 2023 Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) accountability process, which includes summative scores and identification status.

Sharing the School and District Reports with your School Community

To help LEAs share the information in the School Performance Reports and support conversations with their school communities, the NJDOE has developed optional tools that LEAs can use to help communicate about the reports. The School Performance Reports toolkit includes:

A sample letter superintendents can send to their communities announcing the release of the reports;

- A PowerPoint template for presenting school- and district-level data, available on the <u>School Performance Resources webpage</u>; and
- One-page guides to help start conversations for <u>school board members</u>, <u>administrators</u>, <u>educators</u>, and <u>elementary</u> and <u>middle and high school families</u>.

The NJDOE also provides resources on the NJDOE ESSA Resources webpage to help district and school leaders engage with local stakeholders and use their federal funds for the programs and services students need most. School Performance Reports also provide an opportunity for communities to identify new or budding student needs. Information about how emergency federal funds and annual federal grants may be used to best support students can be found online on the NJDOE Maximizing Federal Funds webpage.
