## Chapter 192 Compensatory Education Services for Nonpublic School Students: Eligibility Changes

School districts that have nonpublic schools located within their boundaries are responsible for ensuring that State and federal programs provided to nonpublic school students meet required criteria. The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE), in consultation with and at the recommendation of the Nonpublic Advisory Committee, is implementing a change to the assessment scores that determine nonpublic school student eligibility for Chapter 192 Compensatory Education (CE) services This change applies to students identified as eligible for CE services in Fiscal Year (FY)2025, as indicated on the student application for services form, known as the 407-1 form.

New Assessment Requirements for Compensatory Education Services in Language Arts Literacy and Math for Grades 3-12

A valid and reliable commercial, norm-referenced, standardized instrument that assesses basic or foundational academic skills, is administered systematically, is based on objective data, and yields a national percentile score (NP)

## Eligible score and score sheet:

- In grades 3 through 11, student assessment score on a valid, reliable, and norm-referenced commercial instrument must be:
  - below the 35<sup>th</sup> National Percentile (NP) range
  - between the 35th and 39th NP and must be supported by additional educationally related objective criteria agreed upon during the consultation
- In grade 12, student assessment score on a valid, reliable, and norm-referenced commercial instrument must be:
  - below the 35th NP range and must be supported by additional educationally related objective criteria agreed upon during the consultation
- For information on acceptable assessments, see <u>Guidelines for Auxiliary and</u> Remedial Services (Chapter 192 and 193) for Nonpublic School Students.

**Exception:** The child study team recommendation may take the place of test score requirements for up to one year of Chapter 192 services when a student is determined to no longer need Chapter 193 services but may not be ready for instruction without additional supports.
