## Stop the Bleed Train-the-Educator Program

The New Jersey Department of Education's Office of School Preparedness and Emergency Planning (OSPEP), in partnership with University Hospital Center for Emergency Preparedness and Response in Newark, is providing a Stop the Bleed Train-the-Educator (T-T-E) program. This initiative, aligned with the national <u>Stop the Bleed campaign</u>, aims to equip educators with life-saving skills and empower them to teach school staff and high school students through their health curriculum. The Stop the Bleed T-T-E program is made possible through funding provided by the United States Department of Homeland Security's Homeland Security Grant Program.

The Stop the Bleed T-T-E program is a nationally recognized initiative designed to teach individuals how to take immediate action during bleeding emergencies before professional help arrives. Recognizing that bystanders are often the first on the scene of an emergency, this national campaign emphasizes that acting within the first five minutes of severe blood loss can save lives. Upon completion of the T-T-E program and meeting the professional requirements outlined by the Stop the Bleed program, participants will become certified Stop the Bleed instructors, gaining access to course materials that enable them to impart these crucial skills to school staff high school students.

- Certified Health Teachers;
- School Nurses;
- Certified Athletic Trainer; and
- Other school professionals that meet the <u>Stop the Bleed Instructor Requirements</u>.
