Title I Targeted Assistance Schools – Process to Transition to Schoolwide Programs

Under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), Title I-funded schools currently operating targeted assistance programs have the option to transition to Title I schoolwide programs. Transitioning to a Title I schoolwide program allows a district to use Title I funds to improve academic achievement and enables a school to more effectively leverage Federal funds to upgrade its entire educational program.

All schools planning to transition to a Title I schoolwide program (as outlined on p. 4 of the New Jersey Department of Education Title I Schoolwide Transition Process) must notify the NJDOE by completing the 2025-2026 Application of Intent to Operate a Title I Schoolwide Program by Friday, November 22, 2024. This application will be submitted electronically to the Office of Supplemental Educational Programs via the following link 2025-2026 Application of Intent. Additionally, schools interested in transitioning to a schoolwide program model must attend an informational webinar, *Title I Schoolwide Programs; From Intent to Implementation*, to be held on Wednesday, November 13, 2024. Participants must register at NJDOE Events Registration.

Note: Schools already approved to operate a Title I schoolwide program prior to the 2025-2026 school year do not need to re-apply annually.

Background

The following Title I-funded targeted assistance schools may elect to transition to a Title I schoolwide program for the 2025-2026 school year:

- Title I targeted assistance schools with less than 40-percent poverty, for which the New Jersey
 Department of Education (NJDOE) grants an approved waiver (now completed and approved as part of
 the Intent to Operate Application process); and
- Title I targeted assistance schools that meet the 40-percent poverty requirement.

In accordance with <u>ESEA section 1114</u> a school operating a Title I targeted assistance program <u>ESEA section 1115</u> that elects to transition to a Title I schoolwide program must:

- Conduct at least one year of planning for a transition to a schoolwide program, which may be waived if
 the school previously has been operating under a strategic plan or improvement plan that addresses the
 entire school;
- Consult with all relevant school stakeholder groups; and
- Submit an Annual School Plan (ASP) that addresses the following required components:
 - 1. A Comprehensive Needs Assessment of the entire school;
 - 2. Strategies to identify and address priority needs, including a description of how such strategies will:
 - a. Provide opportunities for all children, including each subgroup of students, as defined in *ESEA* §1111(c)(2), to meet the challenging State academic standards;

- b. Use methods and instructional strategies that strengthen the academic program in the school, increase the amount and quality of learning time, and help provide an enriched and accelerated curriculum, which may include programs, activities, and courses necessary to provide a well-rounded education; and
- c. Address the needs of all children in the school, but particularly the needs of lowachieving students who are at risk of not meeting the challenging State academic standards, through various support activities; and
- 3. An annual evaluation of the implemented programs and services as articulated in the ASP.

Schoolwide Poverty Percentage Waiver Request

Schools with less than 40-percent poverty rates that are interested in transitioning to a Title I schoolwide program for the 2025-2026 school year, must complete the poverty waiver section in the Intent to Operate Application.

Schoolwide Program Guidance
