- If your home or apartment is old (built prior to 1978) there is a strong chance that it has lead paint.
- Lead-based paint is toxic to children and can cause permanent health issues such as brain damage, slowed growth and development, and other problems affecting learning, behavior, hearing, and speech.
- You can get a free and easy home assessment to see if there is lead in your home.
- If lead paint is in your home, State funding is available to remove it from your home for free if income eligible.
