# Streamlined Portfolio Appeals Option Available for Students with Qualifying ASVAB Scores

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) is pleased to once again offer the streamlined portfolio appeals option introduced during the 2024-2025 school year. Local educational agencies (LEAs) and approved private schools for students with disabilities (APSSDs) may continue to use the streamlined portfolio appeals option for students with a qualifying score on the Department of Defense Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) for the 2025-2026 school year.

Students who meet or exceed the minimum required ASVAB Armed Forces Qualification Test (AFQT) score of 35 may use the streamlined portfolio appeals option to demonstrate graduation readiness. As part of the collected documentation maintained on site for each student's portfolio appeals, there must be a record of any ASVAB scores used to qualify the student for the streamlined portfolio appeals option.

## **Requirements for Streamlined Portfolio Appeals**

The streamlined portfolio appeals option for students who meet or exceed the minimum ASVAB score of 35, allows for a 50 precent reduction per content area, in the quantity of portfolio appeals constructed responses tasks (CRTs) that would need to be submitted for eligible students. The CRT requirements for the streamlined portfolio appeals submission are as follows:

- For a student who qualifies for a streamlined ELA portfolio appeal:
  - One reading task (either literary or informational) must be successfully completed;
    and
  - One writing task that is connected to the selected reading task (either informative/explanatory, argument, or narrative) must be successfully completed.
- For a student who qualifies for a streamlined mathematics portfolio appeal:
  - One modeling task (representing one of the 5 conceptual categories not used for reasoning) must be successfully completed; and
  - One reasoning task (representing one of the conceptual categories not used for the modeling task) must be successfully completed.

## **Impacted Resources**

### **Additional Considerations**

Please keep the following in mind regarding the ASVAB option for a streamlined portfolio appeal:

- This is available as an option for students expected to graduate with the class of 2026, but students are not required to take the ASVAB to submit a traditional portfolio appeal.
- If you are not submitting an ASVAB AFQT score for a student, the additional column in the updated spreadsheet template may be left blank.
- An ASVAB AFQT score that meets or exceeds the minimum of 35 allows for submission of a streamlined portfolio appeal for ELA, mathematics, or both.
