Guidelines for Reporting Enrollment, Income Status

For the October 15, 2025 enrollment reporting, please use the following guidance when reporting income status for students in the Application for State School Aid (ASSA), Charter School Enrollment System (CHE), and New Jersey Statewide Longitudinal Education Data System (NJSLEDS):

- A school district may choose to certify its ASSA low-income count supported by 2025-2026 school lunch applications received as of October 15, 2025 and carryover applications from 2024-2025; or
- A school district may update its low income counts through the date of the final ASSA certification. If the district updates its low-income counts using current year applications, then no carryover applications may be included.
- For schools and districts participating in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), low income counts on the ASSA must be supported by SY 2025-2026 School Meals and Summer EBT Application (For Both Standard & CEP Schools/Sites), or Direct Certification.
- There is no change for students who are eligible through the Direct Certification process; current year status must be used.

For NJSLEDS only, students who qualify under the New Jersey Expanded Income Eligibility Guidelines pursuant to the Working-Class Families' Anti-Hunger Act (families with an annual household income between 186 and 224 percent of the federal poverty level) will be categorized as Federal Paid but New Jersey Free. Please refer to the "FreeandReducedRateLunchStatus" data element in the 2025-2026 NJSLEDS Student Management Data Handbook for more information. On the ASSA and CHE, students with an annual household income between 186 and 224 percent of the federal poverty level are not included in the Free/Reduced counts.
