Dynamic Learning Maps: Instructionally Embedded Fall 2025 Assessments Window

To assist educators in the identification of students' specific needs, Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) and the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) are offering the use of DLM's instructionally embedded (IE) assessments in fall of 2025 for students with the most significant intellectual disabilities. The DLM IE assessments may be used by teachers to better understand their students' instructional needs for the 2025-2026 school year. The DLM IE assessments are aligned to Essential Elements on which the student's 2025-2026 instruction will be based and can be used to gather baseline data and guide instruction. Use of the DLM IE assessments is available at no cost, is completely optional, and has no impact on the required year-end, summative DLM assessment.

It is important to note that the DLM IE assessments are separate and distinct from the year-end, summative assessment administered each spring. Results from the fall DLM IE assessments should be used to guide and inform instruction. They do not predict how well students will do on testlets taken during the spring assessment window, nor do they predict students' summative results.

DLM Fall 2025 IE Window

New Jersey districts may access the DLM IE assessments from **September 9 through December 19, 2025,** through the Educator Portal as one way to support students and teachers. The DLM IE assessments must be completed in-person; there is no remote option for administration.

DLM Fall IE Administration and Instructional Resources

District and school staff involved in the administration of the DLM IE assessments should visit the New Jersey DLM website to access the materials, manuals, and other resources necessary to prepare for and administer the optional DLM IE assessments. The following resources will be particularly helpful:

DLM Required Test Administration Training

The DLM-developed required test administrator training is now available. For test administrators who will be administering the optional DLM IE assessments, there is an additional optional module available specifically dedicated to DLM IE assessments.
