# Charter School Organizational Performance Framework

In August 2015, the New Jersey Department of Education released the revised <u>Organizational</u> <u>Performance Framework</u>. The updated Framework provides charter schools with clear and precise information on how a charter school's organizational performance is evaluated and replaces the organizational section of the <u>Performance Framework</u> from 2012. The revised structure of the Organizational Framework also allows the Department to provide clearer criteria to assist charter schools on whether they are meeting expected standards of performance. # Charter School Renewal Site Visit Protocol

As part of the renewal process, the Department conducts site visits aligned to the standards set within the Performance Framework. <u>The Charter School Renewal Site Visit Protocol</u> is designed to provide practical information about the Renewal Site Visit so that stakeholders know what to expect and how to prepare. Familiarity with the procedures, protocols and responsibilities will help to ensure that each visit runs smoothly.
