Take notice that on December 30, 2013, the New Jersey State Board of Education received a

petition for rulemaking from the above petitioner requesting that the Department create a new

administrative rule requiring school districts utilizing the Department of Defense, Armed

Services Vocational Aptitude Battery Career Exploration Program (ASVAB-CEP) to obtain

permission from a parent or legal guardian before administering the examination to students.

Petitioner also requests that the Department create a new administrative rule requiring that, when

administering the ASVAB-CEP, school guidance counselors must select "Option 8," which

prevents the results from automatically being released to the Department of Defense.

A notice acknowledging receipt of the petition was published in the February 18, 2014, New Jersey Register at 46 N.J.R. 400(a). In accordance with applicable law, the Department reviewed the petition and has determined that additional time is needed to deliberate about this petition. Time is needed to further evaluate how school districts administer the ASVAB-CEP Statewide, as well as the disclosure methods used for the assessment results.

Accordingly, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 1:30-4.2(a)3 and 6A:6-4.2(b)3, this matter will be referred for further deliberation for a period not to exceed 90 days.
