Notice of Receipt and Action on Petition for Rulemaking

Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying

N.J.A.C. 6A:9

Petitioner: Deborah Esposito.

Take notice that on October 13, 2019, the New Jersey State Board of Education (State

Board) received a petition for rulemaking from the above petitioner requesting the State Board to

create a new rule at N.J.A.C. 6A:9, Professional Standards, to amend the State law governing the

harassment, intimidation, and bullying (HIB) of public school students. The petitioner requested

for the law to be changed to create a venue for a complaint against a student where the HIB

incident is not motivated by race, religion, gender, etc. The petitioner's request stated that HIB

occurs for many reasons, including unconscious bias, and the current law regarding HIB

incidents gives school districts a loophole to dismiss legitimate claims by saying an incident was

not motivated.

After reviewing the petition, the Department of Education (Department) has concluded

the chapter of New Jersey Administrative Code cited by the petitioner is about professional

standards for teachers and school leaders and not HIB.

Furthermore, the State Board cannot amend the HIB rules at N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.7 to grant

the petitioner's request because the definition of "harassment, intimidation, and bullying" in the

State's Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act (ABR) at N.J.S.A. 18A:37-14 includes the following

language: "reasonably perceived as being motivated either by any actual or perceived

characteristic, such as race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identify and expression, or a mental, physical or sensory disability, or by any other distinguishing characteristic." The ABR at N.J.S.A. 18A:37-15.b requires each school district to adopt a policy concerning HIB that includes a definition of HIB that is no less inclusive than the definition found in the law.

Therefore, the petitioner's request is denied and the petitioner is directed to make the request of the New Jersey Legislature.
