School Ethics Commission Meeting Public Session Minutes

February 18, 2025

Chairperson Bender called the regularly scheduled meeting of the School Ethics Commission (Commission or SEC) to order at 9:39 a.m.

Notice of the special meeting was provided to the State House Press Corps and the Secretary of State and filed as required by the Open Public Meetings Act.

Also, in attendance were Brigid C. Martens, Director, Office of School Ethics, Dana Jones and Jeannine Pizzigoni, staff members, and Amna Toor, Deputy Attorney General (DAG).

II. First Public Comment

At the start of the meeting, Chairperson Bender explained to the public how the meeting would be conducted. More specifically, Chairperson Bender explained that the public would be afforded the opportunity to provide public comment; the Commission would then adjourn to executive session; the Commission would return to public at approximately 12:00 p.m.; at that time, members of the public would be afforded another opportunity to provide public comment; and then the Commission would vote on matters pertinent to its business.

Director Martens also advised the public as follows: individuals wishing to provide public comments/statements during Public Comment regarding a matter pending before the Commission are asked not to litigate the merits of their case as the Commission's review of matters is limited to the written submissions; and everyone in attendance is asked to exercise an appropriate degree of decorum as this is a public forum.

9:42 a.m. Complainant in the matter docketed as C40-24 was present at the public session and provided the following statement:

Hi, my name is Alix Hayes and I am an Oakhurst/Ocean Twp resident and private citizen—also the Complainant in C40-24... I am not here to adjudicate the case

— no worries. But I am also a former journalist, so I came with a few words typed up and appreciate the ability to address you.

I do want to thank the Commission for your due diligence and consideration — and all the hard work the SEC has had to do with a backlog of cases...

Unfortunately, the State has some school board members who don't follow ethics rules, State regulations and laws, Advisory Opinions, and sometimes common sense and best practices.

At the Township of Ocean Board of Education, few things are done via special motions without the benefit of certain school board numbers. And, only a few days ago the OTBOE voted in a motion put forth by one of the respondents in my case to cancel the second public opinion comment session our district has had in place for decades... The last two years this board has gone from unlimited public comments and lengthy Q&A sessions—to a five minute cap per person with no answers ever given. I think it is because they want to suppress opinions that are different from theirs. Perhaps they want to silence discussion from the public about board members and the ethics complaints they face from quite a few critics in town — and of course, myself as a constant critic of their lack of transformative change, lack of communication and lack of transparency. I think, in anticipation of another ethics case currently pending in front of an OAL judge and also the new case before you today, that the OTBOE wants to limit what people know and how the public can hold them to task.

Without commenting as to the merits of today's case of which I am a complainant (C40–24), I did want to remind you that again, sadly, our board does not hold this body in high regard ... they said they do not plan to follow your rules; they said that in a public vote. And also as of January's reorganization meeting and as of this morning, there are board members assigned to committees who are conflicted, and they should not be part of certain committees (case in point, a board member/a retired teacher who has a daughter who teaches in the district yet she sits and chairs the instruction and curriculum committees and sits on the instructional council — which consists of union members and senior administrators.) The flagrant disregard for the SECs Advisory Opinions on the matter still exists.

What also exists, however, is your constant commitment to enforcing State school board Code of Ethics rules and Prohibited Conduct rules. I wish you had more staff and time to catch up on all the cases you have; I don't envy the work you have to do, but it's important work to keep people honest, transparent and ethical. Thank you for your time.

Now therefore be it further resolved that the Commission will return to open session to conduct business at the conclusion of Executive Session.
