"Look at how a single candle can both defy and define the darkness." — Anne Frank — Not harder, just different!

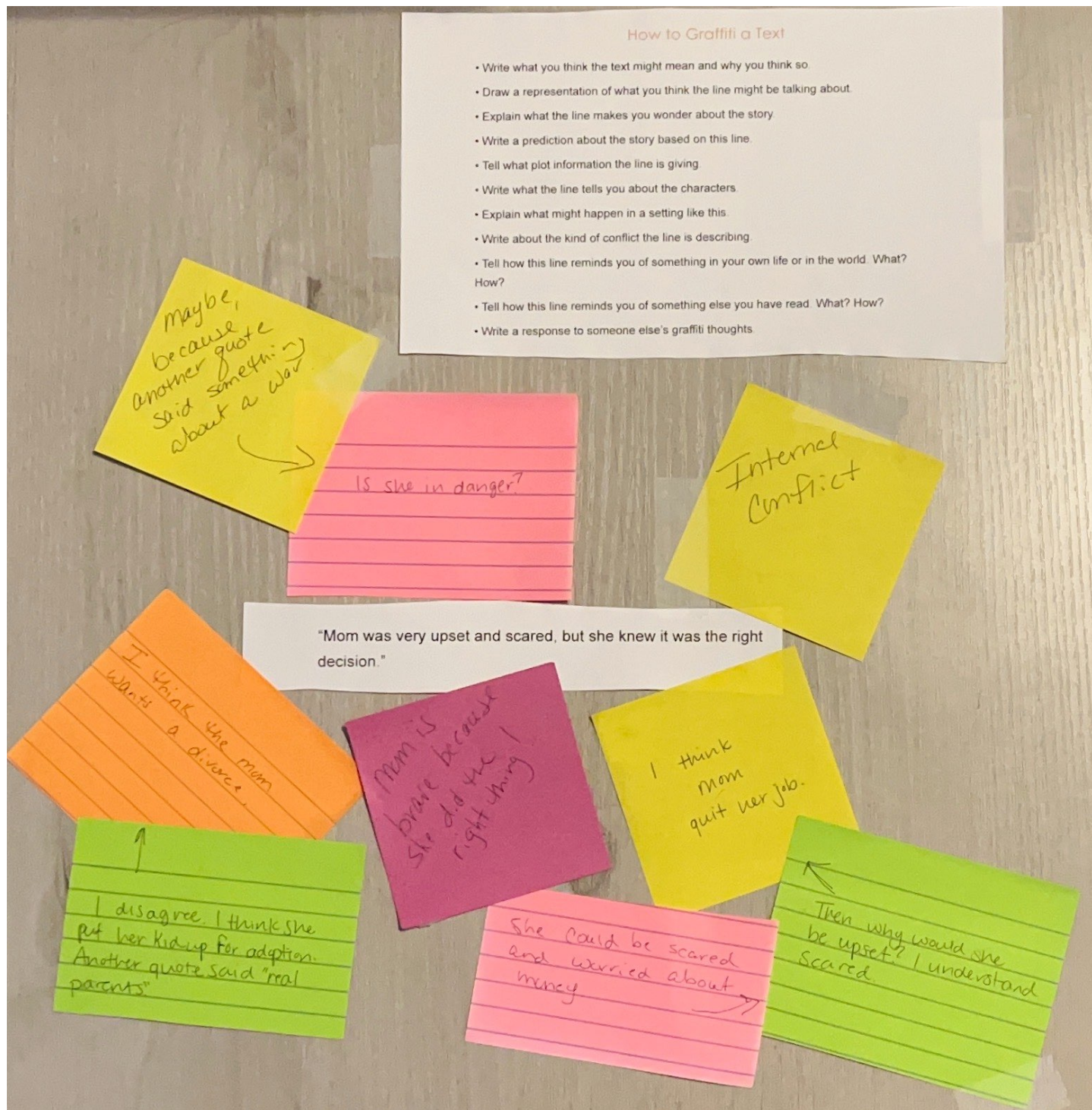
I was gonna write the same thing!
